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Citizen Survey Results Are In

For seventeen years, the City of Auburn has conducted an annual telephone opinion survey to determine how Auburn residents feel about City services, major projects, and other initiatives. The City Council has found the survey to be of great help in monitoring the quality of City services and in establishing budget priorities for future years. The 2002 survey has recently been completed and results are posted on the City's web site, www.auburnalabama.org. Copies are also available at City Hall for review.

Planning Department staff, in conjunction with the Office of the City Manager, develops the survey and provides the training and oversight of the interviewers. Telephone numbers of citizens called are randomly selected from

all of the Water Board accounts and directories. From the pool of randomly selected citizens, 3568 calls were placed which resulted in 640 completed interviews conducted over a two-week period beginning in early February.

The responses indicate that the citizens of Auburn are generally satisfied with City services. One question on the survey was, "Overall, how would you rate the services provided by the City of Auburn?" Over 94 percent of those surveyed rated the services either 'excellent' or 'good.'

When asked about priorities of the City government, the respondents named the school




system (36.1%) as the top priority, and police protection as the second highest priority. Those surveyed also reported that they believe Auburn is a safe community. More than 98 percent said they 'always' or 'most of the time' feel safe in the City and 97.4 percent said they feel safe in their neighborhoods.

We thank all 640 citizens who participated in this year's survey.

The City of Auburn Plans New Cemetery

The City of Auburn and the Cemetery Advisory Board are currently working on the plans for a new cemetery to be located on South Gay Street. Features to be included are a columbarium to hold cremation ashes, a committal shelter for services held at the cemetery, space for upright granite markers, and space for ground level bronze markers.

The inclusion of individual and family mausoleums in the cemetery that provide above-ground crypt space is being considered. To assist with determining if this feature should be included in the plan, the Cemetery Advisory Board is asking anyone who would be interested in purchasing a mausoleum, if available, to respond by calling 887-4930 before May 31.



May I See Your Business License?

Citizens can support the City's efforts to license all companies doing business in Auburn by making sure that the businesses they patronize have a current City business license. Purchasing a business license gives the legal authority to do business within the City of Auburn.



Business license fees are one of the top five revenue sources for the City, providing approximately \$4.5 million or 15% of the budget's resources each year. These license fees, like sales taxes, help to finance City schools, police and fire protection, road maintenance, parks, recreation programs, and other services enjoyed by Auburn citizens.

How can citizens be sure that they patronize licensed businesses? City ordinance requires each business to post its business license in a place that is visible to the public. Customers can ask to see a current City of Auburn business license. The City offers convenient wallet-sized copies of licenses for those who make deliveries or sales calls or who provide services at their customer's site.

When a citizen is solicited by a business, one question that should always be asked is whether or not the business has a current city license. Citizens can verify business license status by calling the City's Revenue Office at 501-7226 (or 501-7227 or 501-7228). By refusing to do business with unlicensed companies, citizens encourage these businesses to become properly licensed. Honoraria and Memorial Gifts

The City of Auburn offers several options to honor or memorialize individuals.

1. **Bricks at Veterans Memorial Monument.** If the individual to be honored was a member of the military, you may purchase a memorial brick to be placed at the Veterans monument located at the northeast corner of Ross and Glenn. The dedication ceremony was held at the site of the Memorial at 8:00 a.m. on Veterans Day, November 11, 2000. The central element of the memorial is a 15-foot high obelisk, positioned in a central plaza surrounded by brick sitting areas, landscaping, and flagpoles. The monument was the first major effort in Auburn to recognize the contributions made toward our freedom by military



veterans. The City Council authorized the use of the City-owned property for this purpose and funding for the monument has been provided through donations and the sale of brick pavers. Bricks engraved with the names of veterans are being sold for \$100 and will continue to be placed in various areas around the monument and in the walkways. For bricks to be placed by Veterans Day 2002, orders need to be in by August. 2. Memorial Books in City Library.
