Phase II Storm Water Garbage Rates to Increase **Compliance Workshop**



On November 14, 2003, the Public Works Department hosted a storm water compliance workshop. The purpose of the workshop was to educate and inform engineers, developers, and contractors of the permitting requirements under the Phase II Storm Water Regulations and to provide best management practice (BMP) installation guidelines.

Representatives from the Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM) gave a presentation outlining the requirements of Phase II Storm Water Regulations. Mr. Earl Norton, representing the Alabama Soil and Water Conservation Committee, introduced the new "Alabama Handbook for Erosion Control, Sediment Control and Storm Water Management on Construction Sites and Urban Areas." The handbook has been recognized by ADEM as the current guide for all construction in the State of Alabama. Mr. Clay Davies of Davies Erosion Control Services Inc. and Rosanna Saxton of Erosion Control & Environmental Supply Inc. provided exhibits of installation practices.

More than 70 local engineers, developers, and contractors attended.




The 2004 Auburn Classic Half Marathon will be held at 7:30 a.m. on Saturday, January 17
