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Bike Bash to be Held March 20

The City of Auburn, in conjunction with the Auburn Bicycle Committee and a number of sponsors, is proud to host Bike Bash 2004. Bike Bash is an event to encourage biking activities, endorse bicycle safety, promote the health benefits of biking, and emphasize local bikefriendly trails and areas.

This year's location is Auburn Junior High School, located on Samford Avenue. Organized ride routes range from three miles to seventeen miles. Three different routes have been designed to accommodate the varying experience



and ability of the riders. A three-mile route is intended for younger or more inexperienced riders. The other two routes, 10 miles and 17 miles, are designed for more experienced riders. The longer routes feature Auburn's newest bike lanes on Wright's Mill Road and the Charlotte and Curtis Ward Bike Path, as well as routes in the Whippoorwill and Grove Hill subdivisions.

The Bike Bash will include demonstrations, informational booths, and live music as a part of the Bike Expo. KOOSTICO will perform again this year to entertain participants with its upbeat, acoustical sound. As a part of the Expo, riders are encouraged to get assistance with helmet fittings and bike inspections from qualified directors prior to the ride. Door prizes will be given away, courtesy of the Bike Bash sponsors. All proceeds from the 2004 Bike Bash benefit future Auburn Bicycle Safety programs.

This year the registration form is available on-line at www.auburnalabama.org/cycle. This form can be printed, completed, and mailed. Participants can also register by stopping by Dean Road Recreation Center. Adult registration is \$10.00 (ages 13 and older) and child registration is \$7.50 (ages 12 and under); this year we also have a family rate of \$20.00. Pre-registration includes the Bike Bash 2004 T-

shirt. Registration will also be taken the day of the event. Don't miss your chance to pull your bicycles out of storage, pump up the tires, grab your helmet, and jump in the saddle to ride!

Can I Park There?

The City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2166 at its November 4, 2003 meeting that prohibits parking of any type of vehicle on "any public right-of-way between the sidewalk and the roadway. This section is not applicable on the days of Auburn University home football games."

Citizens are encouraged not to park on the area between the sidewalk and the road on any street in

Auburn. Since the Ordinance is currently

in effect, the Auburn Police Division is issuing tickets to violators.
