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Mayor's Memorial Day Breakfast Tickets On Sale Now At 10:00 a.m., immediately following the break fast there will be a memorial wreath laying cerem

The City of Auburn will host the sixth annual Mayor's Memorial Day Breakfast on Monday, May 31 at 8:00 a.m. at the Auburn University Hotel and Dixon Conference Center.

At this year's breakfast, Dr. Jim Foy will be awarded the City of Auburn's Distinguished Veterans Award for his service as a Navy fighter pilot during WWII and his superior service to Auburn University and the Auburn community. In addition, the "Military Family" will be honored to recognize the role that spouses and children have historically played in supporting their loved ones who have been deployed.

The first recipient of the Veterans Committee Scholarship will also be announced at the breakfast. The Veterans Committee has established a \$500 scholarship to benefit Auburn High School JROTC members. The most outstanding JROTC member will be chosen based on a number of prerequisites such as grades, activities, and community involvement.

At 10:00 a.m., immediately following the breakfast, there will be a memorial wreath laying ceremony at the Veterans Monument at the northeast corner of Ross Street and Glenn Avenue. In addition, military equipment will be on display at Felton Little Park throughout the day.

Attendees are encouraged to park at the Douglas J. Watson Municipal Complex and Felton Little Park. Handicapped parking will be available on Ross Street, which will be closed during the ceremony.

Breakfast tickets are on sale now at City Hall or from a Veterans Committee member for \$20 each. Students grade

The year 2004 will mark the 48th consecutive year the League of American Bicyclists has declared May to be National Bike Month. In support of the League, the City of Auburn is promoting Bike-to-Work/Bike-to-School Week from May 10 - 14 and Bike-to-Work/Bike-to-School Day on Friday, May 14.

The bicycle is a viable and environmentally sound form of transportation and an excellent form of recreation. The Auburn Bicycle Committee, local schools, the Parks and Recreation Department, local police officers and the bike patrol, along with hospitals, private companies, and civic groups throughout the State will promote bicycling as a wholesome leisure activity as well as an environmentally-friendly alternative to the automobile during the month of May 2004.

The guide highlights local bicycle routes of varying distances and skill levels throughout the Auburn community. During the Fair, more than 200 juniors and seniors had the opportunity to talk to representatives from eight different industries/organizations including: Southern Union, Leonard Peterson, ATS Wheels, Langcourt Ltd., Hoerbiger Hydraulics, Briggs & Stratton, Falk, and Donaldson.

Students stopped by each participating industry's display and asked questions such as what they manufacture, what skills they are looking for from high school graduates, as well as starting pay.
