This year's 5th anniversary festivities will feature something for everyone, including arts and crafts, children's activities, delicious food, live entertainment, and special appearances.



One of the main attractions at CityFest 2005 will be the arts and crafts and fine arts exhibitors. Handmade arts and crafts and artwork from around the Southeast will fill the grounds at Kiesel Park as part of the Children's Art Exhibition, ArtFest

Tent, Arts and Crafts Exhibitor Showcase, and Fine Art Exhibitor Showcase. In addition, the Juried Art Show, new to this year's CityFest, is open to artists 18 years and older who reside in Alabama and contigu-

ous states. Six cash awards will be presented, including a \$500 best of show award. All works entered into the show will be on display in the historical Nunn Winston House on the park grounds. A preview reception for the Juried Art Show will be held in the early evening on Thursday, April 28 at Greystone Mansion. The reception is free and open to the public. All works on display will be for sale.

In addition to arts and crafts, CityFest will feature many exciting activities for children and adults, including a hot air balloon display, the Auburn University Southeastern Raptor Center, Gamma Phi Beta carnival games, more than ten whimsical interactive inflatables, The StoryMaker, an opportunity to meet and

greet Auburn University sports teams, special appearances by Aubie and Smoky Bear, a non-profit vendor showcase, an Eats & Treats Alley, and many other activities and special guests.

Live musical entertainment will be presented throughout the day, featuring Nashville Star, Brad Cotter. Other performances include Mountain Hollow Band, singer/songwriter Dave Potts, Kidd Blue, mini performances by local dance studios, and a performance by the Auburn Unicycle Club.

CityFest 2005 is hosted by the Parks and Recreation Department and presented by McQuick Printing Company and the Opelika-Auburn News. The Parks and Recreation Department works with local and regional businesses throughout the year to provide sponsorships necessary to make Auburn CityFest possible.

City's Excellent Bond Ratings Affirmed

Standard & Poor's and Moody's Investors Service, two of the national credit rating agencies, have affirmed the City's bond ratings of AA- and Aa3, respectively. The City requested a rating review in anticipation of the issuance of \$5 million of general obligation bonds to fund projects Auburn voters approved in the August 2004 Five Mill Tax Referendum. The projects include road reconstruction, the installation of traffic signals, and construction of sidewalks and bikeways throughout the City.

Both rating agencies cited Auburn's diversified revenue base, strong revenue growth, and low overall debt burden as the basis for the affirmation of the ratings. Standard & Poor's reports that "compared to other Alabama municipalities, Auburn relies on a diversified revenue stream, led by sales taxes. With only 50% of its budget dedicated to wages, and a stable municipal workforce, the City has sound expenditure flexibility. Strong revenue growth and expenditure control have allowed the City to maintain strong reserve levels."

All Auburn taxpayers benefit from this good news in the form of less interest paid on the City's bonds. For more information, contact the Finance Department at 501-7220.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

In conjunction with the City of Auburn's celebration of Earth Week, the Environmental Services Department will host the City's 3rd Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, April 16, from 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. at the Environmental Services Building at 365-A North Donahue Drive. This special event offers Auburn residents the opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous household chemicals, which may otherwise give rise to the potential dangers of personal exposure, fire, and contamination of the environment. The City has contracted with Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Inc. to manage the collection and disposal of hazardous waste collected during the event.

Participation is limited to Auburn residential solid waste service customers only. Residents are asked to bring a recent water bill to demonstrate proof of residency. No farmers, commercial businesses, or industry please.

Participants are asked to limit the amount of material they submit for disposal to 20 pounds per household, with individual containers limited to 5 gallons. Larger amounts must be pre-approved. The City will also receive computer equipment for recycling during the event.
