

## **Veterans Day Ceremony**

Citizens are invited to attend the City of Auburn's Annual Veterans Day Ceremony on Friday, November 11 at 10:00 a.m. at the Veterans Memorial, located at the corner of Ross Street and Glenn Avenue. This year's ceremony marks the 5th Anniversary of the Memorial's dedication.

Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. will serve as moderator for the ceremony. The program includes participants from the Auburn High School Jr. ROTC as well as music by the Auburn High School Choral Company and bagpiper Dan Drummond. The ceremony



will conclude with a memorial wreath laying. Following the conclusion of the ceremony, a reception will be held at Greystone Mansion, located at 434 East Magnolia Avenue.

Ceremony attendees are encouraged to park at the Development Services Building and Felton Little Park. Handicapped parking will be available on Ross Street, which will be closed during the ceremony. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will move to the City Council Chamber.

In addition to the Annual Veterans Day ceremony and reception, the Auburn Veterans Committee sponsors several activities throughout the year aimed at increasing Auburn youth's awareness about veterans. One activity includes a *Veterans Speakers Bureau* consisting of veterans from World War II, Korea, Vietnam, the Gulf War, and the current War on Terrorism who are willing to share their military experiences with student groups. In addition to the speakers, the Annual Memorial Day Scholarship is sponsored by the Committee for Auburn High School Jr. ROTC members and honors one outstanding Auburn High Jr. ROTC member for their academic and service accomplishments.

# Adventures in Art

Students from Auburn's five elementary schools participated in Adventures in Art 2005: Shape, Rhythm and Blues at the Jan Dempsey Community Arts Center the week of September 12-16. This grant-funded program allowed 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders to visit the Arts Center for a day of educational art classes.

Students began their day with a live performance by the Alabama Blues Project, a group of musicians whose purpose is to educate students on the role that blues music has played in past and pre-

sent American culture. Following the performance, students divided into groups and rotated through four workshops, including a blues workshop, gallery talk, guilting workshop, and a lesson on the history behind the guilts of Gee's Bend. Students also toured The Quilts of Gee's Bend exhibit at the Jule Collins Smith Museum of Fine Art.

This year's Adventures in Art program was made possible through a partnership between the City of Auburn, Auburn City Schools, Representative Mike Hubbard, and Professor ChiChi Lovett at Auburn University.

receives \$11.63 for every tag whose proceeds are designated to Auburn City Schools. In addition to tag sales, FACES uses funds from other sources to fund teacher mini-grants. To date, FACES has funded 490 grants totaling more than \$190,000.


