City Continues to Receive Recognition for its Outstanding Finances

The City of Auburn has received numerous awards and accolades for its strong financial standing within the governmental finance community. For the last nineteen years, the City has consistently received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. In addition, the City's excellent bond ratings of AA-and Aa3 were recently affirmed by Standard & Poor's and Moody's Investors Service, respectively. At the heart of the City's financial and budgeting success lies the City's Biennial Budget, which includes a six-year capital plan used to develop and implement long-term financial goals for the City.



The Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting was recently awarded to the City of Auburn by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2004. The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management. The CAFR was judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program, including demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate the City's financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the CAFR. This year's Certificate of Achievement represents the 19th consecutive award the City of Auburn has received for its CAFR after receiving its first award in 1986. The City has the second highest number of CAFR awards for any city in the State of Alabama, second only to Birmingham.

In early 2005, the City requested a bond rating review in anticipation of the issuance of \$5 million of general obligation bonds to fund projects Auburn voters approved in the August 2004 Five Mill Tax Referendum. In the review, both bond rating agencies cited the City's diversified revenue base, strong revenue growth, and low overall debt burden as the basis for the affirmation of the ratings. Auburn residents benefit from these excellent ratings in the form of lower interest rates on the City's bonds. The bonds are being used to fund voter-approved projects, including road reconstruction, traffic signal installation, and construction of sidewalks and bikeways throughout the City.

Beginning in FY01, the City of Auburn began utilizing a biennial budget. This two-year budget and six-year capital plan gives the City a longer-range vision of the City's needs, goals, and financial capabilities and enables City management to plan and implement the City's work plan more effectively. The City of Auburn relies on a diverse revenue stream, 40% of which is derived from sales tax. In comparison to other Alabama municipalities,

Auburn sets a goal to use less than 50% of its budgeted expenditures for employees' salaries and benefits. Many municipalities dedicate more than 70% of their budgets to staffing costs. The City's budgetary system encompasses the Citizen Survey results, City Council priorities, long-range and annual goals, key decisions, and a comprehensive capital improvements program that allows the Council and City staff to concentrate on major issues facing the Auburn community, including Auburn City Schools, infrastructure improvements, as well as new facilities and programs.

Auburn residents can take confidence in knowing that the short-term and long-range financial needs of the community will be addressed more effectively through the City's excellent financial management policies and procedures. These policies and procedures are implemented in a cooperative effort by the City's management team and a highly qualified and experienced staff in the Finance Department, as well as financial management staff who work in departments other than Finance. 

The City of Auburn will host a celebration on Saturday, February 4 in honor of Auburn University's 150th Birthday. The Auburn University and City of Auburn celebration at Toomer's Corner signifies the close ties between the City and the University and is just part of a year long celebration.

For the past year, Auburn's Sesquicentennial Committee has been planning for a year long calendar of events to mark this milestone. "Auburn has a lot to celebrate for all that has been accomplished in 150 years," said John Hachtel, Assistant Vice-President for Communications and Marketing and co-chair of the Sesquicentennial Committee. "The entire Auburn family will be proud of the events that we have planned to honor this occasion."

Sesquicentennial events will kick off on February 1 with Founders Day on the Samford Hall Lawn. This lunchtime ceremony will include a presidential presentation, proclamations, ringing of the Samford Hall bells, and refreshments.

The City of Auburn will join the festivities on Saturday, February 4 as the City partners with Auburn University, the Auburn Chamber of Commerce, and the Auburn-Opelika Convention and Visitors Bureau for a Birthday Bash and Block Party. A ceremony commemorating Auburn's 150 years will be held at 2:00 p.m., followed by a concert by the Alabama Blues Brothers at Toomer's Corner, children's activities, inflatables, and birthday cake and favors. Auburn University groups will set up booths downtown to give away items, offer opportunities for Auburn University athletes' autographs, or to just show off items of interest. The culmination of the event will be a fireworks show at 5:30 p.m. from the library parking deck. The show will be visible throughout the downtown area.

"The City of Auburn and Auburn University are tied together in so many ways. It is only fitting that the City join in celebrating the 150th Anniversary of Auburn University," said Mayor Bill Ham. "Toomer's Corner has always been considered the connecting point of the City and the University. It has been the site of many celebrations of our City's and the University's great achievements and I cannot think of a more appropriate place to celebrate Auburn University's past and future."

Other events during the Sesquicentennial Year will include a lecture series sponsored by Pebble Hill, various historic document and memorabilia displays, and activities planned by the various colleges and schools.
