Auburn's Public Safety Department



The City of Auburn's Public Safety Department is dedicated to promoting and maintaining a safe environment in all areas of the City. The department effectively delivers high quality emergency response and preventative services, resulting in extremely modest fire losses, a low crime rate, the best fire insurance classification in the State of Alabama, and a very high level of citizen satisfaction. The Public Safety Department consists of five divisions: Police, Fire, Codes Enforcement, Communications, and Administration.

The Police and Communications Divisions of the Public Safety Department provide coverage for the City, Auburn University, and partial extended jurisdictional areas. The Communications Division is staffed with a minimum of two Communications Officers at all times who are responsible for receiving calls for service and relaying information and instructions for police, fire, medical, and all other emergency services.

The Fire and Codes Enforcement Divisions provide services within the City limits, including Auburn University. In addition to fire suppression, the Fire Division issues burn permits and performs hydrant testing on a routine basis to insure proper hydrant function. The Codes Enforcement Division performs site inspections, conducts plan reviews, and issues all building permits in the City.

Announcing the City of Auburn's Citizens Public Safety Academy

The City of Auburn's Public Safety Department will begin a Citizens Public Safety Academy on February 16. The academy, open to Auburn residents ages eighteen and older, will run for 14 consecutive weeks from 6:30 p.m.-9:30 p.m. each Thursday. Graduation will be held on May 25. During the training period, participants who are accepted will learn about the different areas of public safety including police, fire, communications, and codes enforcement services. Citizens interested in participating in the academy are encouraged to apply early due to limited seating. The program is free for participants. Business License Renewal Deadline is February 28

Any business providing services or selling goods within Auburn's city limits is required to have a City business license. City business licenses expire each year on December 31 and are required by City ordinance to be renewed no later than February 28 to avoid a late fee. All businesses should have received business license renewal packets in the mail. Any business that did not receive its renewal packet should contact the Revenue Office at 501-7239 to verify its mailing address and request another packet.

Any business that would like to have wallet-sized, laminated duplicates of its business license for employees who make deliveries or sales calls in Auburn or who provide services at customers' sites may request them from the Revenue Office. The price for these is \$1 each.

The City Revenue Office is located in City Hall at 144 Tichenor Avenue. For more information about the City's business license requirements, call 501-7239.



Street Safety

The usage of golf carts, all-terrain vehicles (ATVs), and go-carts in the City of Auburn continues to rise. Therefore, it is important for citizens to understand the operating rules on public roads to ensure the safety of pedestrians, residents, and the operators of these vehicles.

Under Alabama law, a motor vehicle is described as "every vehicle, which is self-propelled." Citizens should be aware that it is against the law for anyone under the age of 16, except with a learner's permit, to operate a motor vehicle on the road. In addition, section 32-5-65 of the Code of Alabama makes it illegal for any owner or person in charge of a motor vehicle to permit a child under 16 to drive. This is a misdemeanor and punishable by imprisonment for no more than 10 days and a fine of no more than \$100. Any subsequent convictions can carry more harsh penalties.

In order for a vehicle to be street legal, it must have properly working headlights, taillights, brake lights, seatbelts, and a registered tag. Alabama law states that any vehicle, which has a maximum speed of 25 mph, must be identified with a reflective device.




