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

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## Bike Bash 2006

In conjunction with Auburn University's Sesquicentennial Celebration, the Parks and Recreation Department and the Auburn Bicycle Committee will present Bike Bash 2006 on Saturday, March 18 on the Auburn University campus. Bike Bash is a community event designed to inform citizens about bicycle safety and promote biking as a fun and healthy leisure activity, in addition to emphasizing local bike-friendly facilities in and around Auburn. This year's Bike Bash consists of three bike routes highlighting the rich history and architecture of the Auburn campus. The routes include a short ride (approximately 3 miles), a medium ride (approximately 9 miles), and a long ride (approximately 19 miles). All routes begin and end at the Auburn University Intramural Fields off of Biggio Drive. Participants are required to wear a helmet.





During the event, there will be free bicycle safety inspections, helmet fittings, and information booths, as well as live music from the returning crowd pleaser, KOOSTICO. Door prizes will include a bicycle provided by The Bike Shop, fun goodies from Bike Friday and Rivendell Bicycle Works, and much more. A rest stop will be provided along the medium and long rides, courtesy of Chick-fil-A. Sponsors of the event include the Auburn Civitan Club, The Bike Shop, Briggs and Stratton, Eagle Tire, Fat Daddy's, Magnolia Cleaning, Niffer's Place, Prestige Properties, Dr. Robert McAlindon, and Weidmann Plastics.

## Residential Occupancy Regulations in the City

Before you renew your lease or sign a new lease on a rental property, contact the City's Planning Department at 501-3040 to see if you and your roommates will be in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance. The City's Zoning Ordinance defines the term family as "two or more persons residing in a single dwelling unit where all members are related by blood, marriage, adoption or guardianship up to the second degree of consanguinity,

plus one unrelated person in the LDD, NC, and DDH zones." In all other zoning districts where residential units are permitted, RDD, CDD, US, and UC,

the term "family" may include up to five unrelated persons occupying a single family dwelling. The enforcement procedures entail observation of alleged violators, which can lead to a search warrant being issued for the residence and/or a hearing in Municipal Court. #### Auburn Softball Complex Named ASA Complex of the Year

The Auburn Softball Complex was recently awarded the 2005 Alabama ASA Complex of the Year Award at the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) Hall of Fame Banquet in Dothan on January 14. In addition, the Cities of Auburn, Anniston, Cullman, Decatur, Dothan, Gadsden, and Montgomery were each honored with Parks of the Year Awards. The Parks of the Year Award ecognizes the championship softball tournaments hosted by Alabama cities. The awards were presented by Alabama ASA Commissioner G. Pat Adkison, who received the award have hosted a majority of the more than 300 ASA National Championships held in Alabama during Adkison's 37 years as State Commissioner. These tournaments have played a huge role in the success of the ASA during the past 31

years.

ASA is the oldest and largest amateur softball organization in the United States and is the national governing body of amateur softball. The ASA has become one of the Nation's largest and fastest growing sports organizations and now sanctions competition in every state through a network of 87 local associations. It has grown from a few hundred teams in the early days to more than 250,000 teams today, representing a membership of more than four million. All in-

## **Auburn City Council to Hold April 11th Referendum**

The City Council will hold a referendum on Tuesday, April 11, for Auburn residents to vote on using the Five Mill Tax Fund for an expansion of the City Library and for the construction of the Yarbrough Tennis Center off Richland Road.

ternational play in the United States goes through the ASA, including the Women's Olympic Team and all US world teams.



This referendum does  $\underline{\textbf{not}}$  involve the addition of new taxes.

Of the property taxes collected each year, the City places five mills of the property taxes into the Special Five Mill Tax Fund. By law, this money can only be used to pay for projects that have been approved by Auburn voters in referenda. The City Council saves these funds for major projects. The Soccer Complex on Wire Road and Town Creek Park were constructed using the Special Five Mill fund.



The City of Auburn will be accepting applications for absentee ballots through April 6. Voters may cast absentee ballots through April 11. The last day to register to vote for this referendum is March 31, 2006. Voter registration forms are available at City Hall, the Auburn Public Library, and the Lee County Board of Registrars.

# **Erosion and Sediment Control Workshop**

On December 14, 2005, the Water Resource Management Department hosted the City of Auburn's fourth annual Erosion and Sediment Control Workshop at Kiesel Park as part of the City's Phase II Storm Water Management Program. The purpose of the workshop was to educate and interact with engineers, developers, and contractors who are governed by the City's Erosion and Sediment Control (ESC) Ordinance and the Alabama Department of Environmental Management's (ADEM) storm water regulations. More than 70 participants attended this year's event.

A local erosion and sediment control consultant conducted a presentation on the Qualified Credentialed Professional (QCP)/Qualified Credentialed Inspector (QCI) construction site inspection process, in addition to typical problems that inspectors are encountering as a result of poor or improper maintenance of erosion and sediment control best management practices (BMPs). ADEM requires that all permitted construction sites be inspected after each 3/4-inch rainfall event or a minimum of once a month by a registered QCP/QCI. Davies Erosion Control and Environmental Supply provided field demonstrations on the latest technologies in erosion and sediment control as well as the proper installation of existing erosion and sediment control best management practices.

Watershed Division Manager Matt Dunn gave an overview of the City's Erosion and Sediment Control Inspection program, focusing on the City's Erosion and Sediment Control inspection enforcement mechanisms that were adopted by the City Council in December 2004. Mr. Dunn also highlighted the City's water sampling program which was initiated in December 2004 to provide a measure of the performance of BMPs on active construction sites. The presentation also stressed the importance of maintenance of erosion and sediment control BMPs as well as the City's seeding and mulching requirement, which states that areas that are cleared of vegetation and will remain so for 15 days or longer without appreciable construction activity should be seeded

and mulched within 5 days of being disturbed.
