

Auburn CityFest 2006 featuring a Blues Extravaganza

The City of Auburn invites the entire community to CityFest, Auburn's largest free, outdoor arts and crafts festival, on Saturday, April 29 from 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. at Kiesel Park. Last year, more than 30,000 people came out to take part in the day's festivities. Auburn CityFest 2006 presented by the *Opelika-Auburn News* promises to be an exciting day of music, culture, games and food.

This year, visitors are invited to stroll through the Artists' Marketplace and the Arts and Crafts exhibitor booths to enjoy fine artwork and homemade arts and crafts. While checking out the artwork, be sure to stop by the Children's Art Exhibition and Non-Profit Showcase.

CityFest further supports the arts through the second annual Juried Art Show. All artists' work will be on display in the historical Nunn-Winston House on the park grounds the day of CityFest. Six cash awards, including a \$500 Best in Show prize, will be presented to winning participants judged by a committee. A preview reception for all artists participating in the juried art show will be held at The Greystone Mansion on Wednesday, April 26 at 5:30 p.m. This event is free and open to the public.

In addition to hundreds of exhibitor booths, CityFest will feature exciting activities for all ages. In the Children's Imagination Station, kids can bounce on several inflatables; watch a performance by the energetic Storymaker, a storyteller who uses puppetry to tell tales; and play carnival games in the Gamma Phi Beta carnival. Throughout the day, the Children's Imagination Station will host several events, including a hot air balloon display. The Silver Wings skydivers from Fort Benning, GA will descend from the sky into a large field at the festival at 10:30 a.m.

BellSouth, community sponsor of CityFest, will be sponsoring the Blues Extravaganza. Headlining this year's festival entertainment is Willie King and the Liberators. King is bringing two blues diva friends, Debbie Bond and Caroline Shines, daughter of blues great Johnny Shines. Clint Darby and Kip Traylor, an acoustic duo from Montgomery, will kick off the day's musical entertainment at 9 a.m. There will also be mini performances by Village Squares and the Auburn Unicycle Club.

CityFest 2006 is hosted by the Parks and Recreation Department and is



Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day 2006

The Environmental Services Department will host the City's 4th Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, April 15 from 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. at the Environmental Services complex, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. This annual event offers Auburn residents the opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous household chemicals stored at their homes. The City has contracted with Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Inc. to manage the collection and disposal of chemicals collected during the event.

Participation is limited to Auburn residential solid waste service customers only. Residents are asked to bring a recent water bill to demonstrate proof of residency. No farmers, commercial businesses, or industry please.

Participants are asked to limit the amount of material they submit for disposal to 20 pounds per household, with individual containers limited to 5 gallons. Larger amounts must be pre-approved. The City will also collect computers and related equipment for recycling during the event.

All City residential customers are encouraged to participate. Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day is a rain or shine event. For more information, contact the Environmental Services Department at 501-3080.

Public Safety Academy Rescheduled


