Welcome Back Students Residential Occupancy Reminder

The City of Auburn would like to welcome back all of our students from the summer break. As a new semester begins and students settle in their new housing, we would like to take this opportunity to remind Auburn residents of the City's Zoning Ordinances regarding residential occupancy in the City limits.

In an effort to protect traditional family neighborhoods and provide Residential neighborhoods that are suitable living environments for students, the City has taken several steps to help identify residential occupancy limitations. Generally speaking, in traditional residential neighborhoods, no more than two unrelated persons may reside at an address. A brochure highlighting specific information on the City's occupancy limitations may be accessed at www.auburnalabama.org and click on Residential **Occupancy Information** under Hot Topics. Brochures are also available in the City's Planning Department, located at 171 North Ross Street, Suite 100. For questions concerning where your

particular property lies within the zoning regulations, visit the City's web site at www.auburnalabama.org and click on Map of Occupancy Limitations under the Hot Topics listing. Zoning information can also be found on the City's Geographic Information

System (GIS) site at gis.auburnalabama.org. Residents in violation of reside at an address. the City's residential occupancy are subject to eviction. Property

owners found to be in violation of occupancy regulations are subject to fines and possible jail time as set forth in the City of Auburn Zoning Ordinance.

If you suspect there is a residence in violation of the City's occupancy regulations, please visit the City's web site at www.auburnalabama.org and click on the Unrelated Occupancy Complaint Form under Hot Topics to initiate the formal complaint process. Residents should complete the information requested in the form and return it to the City's Planning Department. Residents will **not** be required to gather evidence for complaint proceedings.

Game Day 2006 Traffic Plan

Football season kicks off with the first Auburn University home game scheduled for Saturday, September 2 against Washington State. As always, traffic will be heavy during home game weekends and residents are asked to be particularly safety conscious when driving. After each game:

 Those traveling on East Thach Avenue will find that Thach will be a temporary one-way street eastbound from South College Street to South Dean Road. Residents on East Thach should keep this in mind when exiting their driveways, as both lanes will be moving "east-only" for up to two hours after each game.

Travelers on North Donahue Drive will find that the roadway will be temporarily one-way northbound from the stadium to State Highway 14.

 Fans wishing to leave and travel southbound on Interstate 85 are encouraged to take Wire Road to I-85 South.

· All vehicles in the left lanes on temporary one-way streets will be required to turn left and those in the right lane will be allowed to turn right or go straight where applicable.

 Fans should be advised that construction will be taking place at the Bent Creek Interchange (Exit 57) throughout the season. Please use caution when traveling in this area.
