## **Auburn's Interchanges**

With the final phase of construction nearly complete at South College Street/Highway 147 (Exit 51), attention has turned to the Bent Creek Interchange (Exit 57). Construction on the Bent Creek Interchange upgrades began on Monday, August 14. The Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) will be

managing this project for the duration of construction. The project includes improvements to the Interstate on and off ramps, the construction of a new bridge, and minor traffic reconfigurations. City and State officials hope to have construction completed by late summer 2007. In addition, construction on Auburn's new \$18.4 million interchange, the Auburn Technology Park Interchange (Exit 50), is expected to begin later this year.

City, State, and Federal officials have worked together to ensure that Auburn's interchanges have the necessary upgrades to help relieve traffic congestion and bolster the City's economy by providing infrastructure needed for commercial and industrial growth.

## **Are You Visible?**

Fall is here and many citizens are taking advantage of the nice weather to bicycle, jog, or walk. This is a reminder that City Ordinance 1272 requires bicyclists, walkers, and joggers to wear reflective clothing from one-half hour before sunset until one-half hour before sunrise in order to be visible to automobile drivers. This reflective material must be worn between the waist and shoulders on the front and back. In addition, all bicyclists must have an operating

headlight on the front of their bicycles and reflectors on the front and rear spokes of the wheels and pedals. Reflective materials must give indication of the presence of a bicyclist, walker or jogger by the headlights of a motor vehicle at a distance of a minimum of 500 feet.

By working together we can help make Auburn's roadways safer for walkers, joggers, bicyclists, and motorists.

# Don't Throw that Pumpkin in the Trash Pile!

The City of Auburn is asking residents to place old pumpkins in their City issued roll-out garbage carts instead of placing them in the trash pile at the curb. Pumpkins are considered a food item and must be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Trash piles should only consist of discarded shrubbery clippings, grass clippings,

weeds, fallen leaves, vines, branches, and limbs. For questions concerning items that are acceptable for garbage collection and trash piles, please contact the Environmental Services Department at 501-3080.



## **Sewer Fees Increase**

Auburn residents will notice an increase in their monthly sewer rates beginning October 1. The City of Auburn's FY07&08 Biennial Budget adopted in July of this year calls for a 5% increase in monthly sewer rates. Beginning with bills due by October 15, the new minimum monthly bill (3,000 gallons or less) for a residential customer with a 3/4" water meter will now be \$9.18 each month for sewer services, an increase of 42 cents per month. For the average residential customer with a usage of 7,000 gallons, the new rate will be an increase of 98 cents per month. The increase in rates will be utilized to fund sewer services to Auburn sewer customers.
