

City Receives Excellent Bond Rating News

The City of Auburn and its citizens recently received outstanding news relating to the City's bond ratings. The City requested a rating review in anticipation of the issuance of \$5.2 million of bonds for construction of the Special Five Mill Tax projects approved by Auburn voters in April 2006. Residents overwhelmingly approved the use of the Special Five Mill Tax fund for a 12,000 square foot expansion at the Auburn Public Library, slated to break ground in mid-spring, and the Auburn Tennis Complex, scheduled for completion in early April of this year. Upon undergoing a credit rating review, the City's bond underwriter sent notification that Standard & Poor's Ratings Services will be upgrading the City's bond rating from AA- to a straight AA. The City also received notification that Moody's Investors Service will be reaffirming the City's current Aa3 rating. These ratings are extremely noteworthy accomplishments and are a direct result of the City's financial plan meticulously outlined in the current Biennial Budget, passed by the City Council in July 2006. The ratings reflect the City's sound financial management, a strong and diversified revenue base, and solid financial reserves. It is rare for a city of Auburn's size to achieve a double-A rating from Standard & Poor's. Smaller cities typically do not have the financial strengths required to obtain a double-A rating. Cities with an AA rating must exemplify excellence both in financial standing and reporting. Only five other cities in the State of Alabama have an Aa3 rating as affirmed by Moody's. Auburn residents can take confidence in knowing that the City's finances remain strong, as evidenced by its most recent bond ratings. City Management continues to make budgeting and financial disclosure and documentation a foremost priority. Citizens benefit from the City's excellent bond ratings in the form of lower interest rates when the city borrows money. Public funds saved on lower interest rates may then be budgeted for other worthwhile City projects.

City to Begin Issuing Vehicle Noise Citations February 10

The Auburn Police Division will begin issuing non-traffic citations for vehicle noise and vibrations beginning Saturday, February 10, per the authority of the disorderly conduct section of the Alabama Criminal Code as adopted by City Ordinance. Officers will issue citations for any vehicle whose noise is deemed unreasonable; for example, a car stereo whose noise can be heard and/or felt from a distance of 25 feet or more. Citations will carry a fine of \$200, in addition to \$125 assessed in court costs.

The new vehicle noise citations are a result of requests from Auburn residents to address the specific issue of vehicle noise. Noise in residential neighborhoods, including parties, bands, and other disturbances, is handled through the disorderly conduct section of the Alabama Criminal Code. Noise from barking dogs is addressed through the City's Dog Ordinance. Complaints regarding noise in residential areas may be reported to the City of Auburn's 24-hour non-emergency Public Safety number at 501-3100. This number has been established to keep the City's 9-1-1 lines open for true emergencies.

The Auburn Police Division will begin issuing vehicle noise citations for any vehicle whose noise is deemed unreasonable, beginning Saturday, February 10.

Additional Information on Towing in the City of Auburn

Please note that the information included in the January issue of *Open Line* highlighting towing regulations, as established by City Ordinance, applies to towing from private property, apartment complexes, and businesses. Regulations do <u>not</u> apply to any tows made from the scene of an accident or tows requested due to a disabled vehicle. CDBG Funds Available for Parks and Recreation Registration Fees

The City of Auburn has allocated Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to cover the cost of registration fees for youth, up to age 18, to participate in sports programs available through the City of Auburn's Parks and Recreation Department. CDBG funds may be used to pay for registration fees up to \$50. In order to qualify for assistance, a household must meet the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) income requirements. Funds are available for a limited time. Before You Sign Your Lease...

Before you sign your lease for the 2007-2008 school year, the City of Auburn would like to remind student residents of the City's Zoning Ordinance regarding residential occupancy in the City limits. Generally speaking, in traditional residential neighborhoods, no more than two unrelated persons may reside at an address. These guidelines were established in an effort to protect traditional family neighborhoods and provide suitable living environments for students. A brochure highlighting specific information on the City's occupancy limitations may be accessed at www.auburnalabama.org and click on Residential Occupancy Information under Hot Topics. Brochures are also available in the City's Planning Department, located at 171 North Ross Street, Suite 100. For questions concerning where your particular property lies within the zoning regulations, visit the City's web site at www.auburnalabama.org and click on Map of Occupancy Limitations under Hot Topics. Zoning information may also be found on the City's Geographic Information System (GIS) site at gis.auburnalabama.org.

Residents in violation of the City's residential occupancy regulations are subject to eviction. Property owners found to be in violation of occupancy regulations are subject to fines and



possible jail time, as set forth in the City of Auburn Zoning Ordinance. Before you sign your lease, make sure you are in compliance with the City's residential occupancy requirements. For more information on residential occupancy, please contact the City's Planning Department at 501-3040.
