

City Council Makes Key Changes to Meeting Agenda

At its February 6 meeting, the City Council authorized several key changes to Auburn City Council meetings. City Council meetings will now convene at 7:00 p.m. on the first and third Tuesday of each month. The Council will continue to meet as a Committee of the Whole prior to the City Council meetings at a time advertised on the Friday afternoon prior to all monthly meetings.

In response to citizen requests, the Council also authorized moving Citizens' Communications from the end of the agenda toward the beginning.



Citizens will be permitted up to 5 minutes to address the Council. An unlimited number of citizens will be allowed to speak.

The Auburn City Council will continue to meet on the first and third Tuesday of every month, now at 7:00 p.m. Council agendas are published on the Friday afternoon prior to each monthly meeting and are now available online at www.auburnalabama.org/citycouncil/agenda. Traffic Calming Request Form



5th Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day Saturday, March 31

The Environmental Services Department will host the 5th Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, March 31 from 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. at the Environmental Services complex, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. This annual event offers Auburn residents the opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous household chemicals stored at their homes. The City has contracted with Clean Harbors Environmental Services, Inc. to manage the collection and disposal of chemicals collected during the event.

Participation is limited to Auburn residential solid waste service customers only. Residents are asked to bring a recent water bill to demonstrate proof of residency. No farmers, commercial businesses, or industry please.

Participants are asked to limit the amount of material they submit for disposal to 20 pounds per household, with individual containers limited to 5 gallons. Larger amounts must be pre-approved. The City will also collect computers and related equipment for recycling during the event.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day is a rain or shine event. All City residential customers are encouraged to participate. For more information, please contact the Environmental Services Department at 501-3080.



More than 250 cars dropped off materials throughout the day at the 2006 Household Hazardous Waste Day. Nearly 15,000 lbs of household hazardous waste, chemicals, and other materials were collected. The City of Auburn is one of only a select number of cities in the State of Alabama to offer a household hazardous waste collection day as an annual event for its citizens.

- Unknown gas cylinders


