Auburn CityFest 2007 Saturday, April 28



The 7th Annual Auburn CityFest is set for Saturday, April 28 from 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. at Kiesel Park. CityFest is Auburn's largest FREE, outdoor festival and is open to all ages.

More than 35,000 people visit the festival each year to participate in the day's events. This year's CityFest, presented by the *Opelika-Auburn News*, promises to be a day filled with art, music, food, and fun.

This year, attendees will have an opportunity to visit exhibitors featuring fine art and homemade arts and crafts, shop for hand woven baskets and hand crafted jewelry, and visit the Non-Profit Showcase, Children's Art Exhibition, and a variety of other attractions.

Along with exhibitor booths, CityFest will have activities for all ages. The Silver Wings Skydivers from Fort Benning, GA will return to the skies of CityFest this year for an encore performance. This year, the Silver Wings are scheduled to land at the backside of the green parking lot located near the dog agility area at 10:30 a.m. Patrons must enter through the Children's Imagination Station.

Plan to bring the children for a fun-filled day of jumping and fun at the Children's Imagination Station. This year's Imagination Station features more inflatable games than ever before, including Winston the Wonder Whale, a Giant Slide, Mini Obstacle Course, Laugh-N-Learn/Bouncer Maze, Bungee Run, Balloon Typhoon, and much more. Patrons will enjoy the return of the Southeastern Raptor Center this year. In addition, Auburn University sports teams and Aubie will also be present at various times throughout the day.

Music lovers are encouraged to visit the Entertainment Pavilion throughout the day for performances by local and regional favorites. Performers include Martha's Trouble, an acoustic duo from Opelika, local favorites Tim Tyler and Lane Wood, and a headlining performance from the East Alabama bluegrass band, Distant Cousins. Don't miss performances by the Village Squares as well. Be sure to see the CityFest schedule included in this month's *Open Line* for a complete performance schedule.

Enjoy delicious snacks and lunch options from any number of food vendors, including Chick-fil-A, BBQ sandwiches, hamburgers, hotdogs, lemonade, funnel cakes, and cotton candy. Bring your blanket and chairs and plan to picnic on the lawn while enjoying the sights and sounds of the performances.

The City of Auburn supports the arts through the Annual Juried Art Show. Works will be on display during CityFest in the historical Nunn-Winston House located on the park grounds. Six cash awards, including a \$500 Best in Show prize, will be presented to winning participants, as judged by a committee. A preview reception will be held on Wednesday, April 25 from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at Ariccia Italian Trattoria & Bar. This event is free and open to the public.



2007 Citizen Survey Results

Over 95% of Residents Rank Auburn as an Excellent or Good Place to Live

Recently, the City of Auburn completed its annual Citizen Survey to determine how residents feel about City services. This survey was conducted by the ETC Institute of Olathe, Kansas. A representative of ETC will present the results of the survey to the City Council and the public at the Tuesday, April 3 Committee of the Whole meeting.

For more than twenty years, the City of Auburn has conducted an annual survey of its residents. Results of the survey have proven to be a great asset to the City Council as a measure of the quality of City services and a gauge for establishing budget priorities for the future.

Major findings of this year's Citizen Survey include:



- Of the citizens surveyed who had an opinion, 91% were satisfied with the quality of the City's **public school system**.
 More than 86% of the citizens surveyed who had an opinion are satisfied with the quality of the City's **police, fire, and**
- ambulance services.
- Nearly 87% of the citizens surveyed who had an opinion were satisfied with the quality of life in the City.

Over the next two years, Auburn residents feel that the City should continue to place a high priority on the management of traffic flow in the City and the maintenance of City streets, buildings, and facilities. Over the next 12-18 months, Auburn residents will see several key projects addressing these concerns, including the completion of the expansion at the Bent Creek Interchange, as well as more than \$1.2 million in street repaving and re-striping for FY 2007.

Results of the 2007 Citizen Survey will be posted online by Wednesday, April 4 at <u>www.auburnalabama.org</u>. Copies of the results will also be available at City Hall at that time. Auburn Public Library Antiques Database Available for Use

The Auburn Public Library has subscribed to the p4A Antiques Reference Database. The database is focused on the American regional marketplace. Antiques are organized into 1,280 different classifications on subjects including furniture, glass, pottery and porcelain, paintings, prints, clocks, toys, dolls, advertising collectibles, books, autographs, lamps, silver, firearms, and historical documents. Each record includes information on when and where the item was sold as well as the price realized. The database also includes at least one color picture for every record. Currently, over 250,000 photos are included with more being added every day.
