# **City to Break Ground on Phase 1 of Northwest Village Subdivision June 5**

The City of Auburn's Community Development Division administers public assistance through Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Auburn is one of a select number of cities in Alabama that receives these funds directly from the Federal government. Funds are available on June 1 each year and may be used for utility assistance, mortgage assistance, housing rehabilitation, rental assistance, and demolition and clearance. In addition, the City has allocated CDBG funds to various non-profit agencies that provide services to the elderly and youth. Funds for the 2007 fiscal year will be available beginning Friday, June 1. In order to qualify for assistance, a household must meet HUD income requirements.

One of the biggest projects currently underway in the Community Development Division is the Northwest Village Subdivision. In January 2006, the City of Auburn, in conjunction with the North Auburn Housing Development





Corporation, broke ground on the Northwest Village Subdivision, Auburn's newest affordable housing subdivision. Located off Foster Street in northwest Auburn, the Northwest Village Subdivision was created to give all Auburn residents the

opportunity to become homeowners. Since 2006, crews have

been working to install infrastructure improvements, including water and sewer, drainage, curb and gutter, and roads. On Tuesday, June 5, the City will break ground on the first phase of homes, to include four new homes. Construction is expected to be complete by the end of the year. Four applicants have been approved for mortgage loans for these homes. The City of Auburn and the North Auburn Housing Development Corporation anticipate building a total of nine homes by the end of the year.

# **Traffic Circle Rules**

One of the most popular traffic calming devices used in Auburn neighborhoods is the traffic circle. Traffic circles function as miniature roundabouts and help to redirect cut-through traffic, reduce accidents, mitigate the severity of accidents, and reduce speeds by as much as 9-10 mph.

While traffic circles are an effective means of slowing down vehicular traffic, there are several rules for maneuvering around them that drivers should keep in mind so that they are utilized to their fullest extent:

- All roads approaching the circle are marked with yield signs. Drivers approaching the circle should yield to traffic already in the circle
- If two vehicles arrive at the circle at the same time, the vehicle to the right goes first.
- The recommended speed for a traffic circle is 15 mph. This speed is recommended because it allows motorists to maneuver the intersection slowly enough to yield to the vehicles already in the circle.
- When making a left turn, drivers must go all the way around the circle before turning left.

Traffic circles are a safe and effective means for slowing traffic in residential neighborhoods when drivers understand the rules to maneuver them. By working together, we can help make Auburn's streets safer for everyone.
