Fire Division Adds New Truck to Fleet

The Auburn Fire Division has a new tool to utilize in providing fire protection to Auburn citizens. The Fire Division recently added a 95-foot aerial platform quint truck to its arsenal of fire fighting vehicles. The City Council authorized the purchase of the new truck at the February 6 City Council meeting. The truck was placed into service on Wednesday, November 14.

A quint truck is a fire truck that has a water pump, a water tank, a fire hose, a ground ladder, and an aerial ladder. Prior to the addition of this new truck, the City had one 75-foot quint truck in its fleet. The addition of the new 95foot quint truck will enable Fire Division personnel to reach buildings taller than three stories. The 95-foot ladder also gives firefighters a horizontal reach, allowing them to easily access buildings that sit further off the road. The new truck is housed at Fire Station No. 1 on East Magnolia Avenue and will primarily cover downtown, as well as the campus of Auburn University.

Police Division Applies for Grant with Assistance from Representative Mike Hubbard

Recently, the Auburn Police Division applied for a \$25,000 grant from the State of Alabama with the assistance of Representative Mike Hubbard. If awarded, the grant would allow the Police Division to purchase a latent evidence imaging system, which will aid in the collection of evidence at a crime scene. Funds would also be used to purchase a speed dependent message board that will alert drivers of their speed in an attempt to help decrease traffic accidents.

Community Development Block Grant Funds Available for Assistance

The City of Auburn's Community Development Division administers public assistance through Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Funds are currently available for utility assistance, mortgage assistance, housing rehabilitation, rental assistance, and site demolition and clearance.



The City has also allocated CDBG funds to cover the cost of registration fees for youth, up to age 18, to participate in sports programs available through the City of Auburn Parks and

Christmas Tree Recycling

This holiday season, don't throw your Christmas tree away, recycle it. The City of Auburn Environmental Services Department will collect Christmas trees placed out with customers' weekly curbside collections. Trees are recycled as part of the City's routine bulky waste (trash) collection program. Last year, City crews collected more than 1700 trees following the holiday season. Trees should be placed at the curb for recycling on your regularly scheduled collection day.

Recycle Your Holiday Boxes

Be sure to recycle the boxes from your gifts this holiday season. Cardboard boxes and gift boxes are picked up as part of the City's Curbside Recycling Program and may also be recycled at the RecycleAuburn Drop-Off Center, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. Customers wishing to place their cardboard at the curb for recycling should break down all boxes and leave them at the curb for pick-up on their regularly scheduled collection day.
