

More than 40,000 people visit the festival each year and participate in the day's events. Auburn CityFest, presented by the Opelika-Auburn

News and hosted by the City of Auburn, will be a day filled with art, music, food, and fun. CityFest is Auburn's largest FREE, outdoor festival and is open to all ages.

Patrons of the event will have an opportunity to visit hundreds of exhibitors featuring fine art and homemade arts & crafts. Visitors of this year's festival will be able to shop for hand woven baskets, hand-crafted jewelry, candles, children's clothing, paintings, birdhouses, and much more. Going Green Saves Green

In February, all diesel-burning vehicles in the City of Auburn's fleet converted from ultra low sulphur diesel fuel to biodiesel fuel. The new fuel is a combination of diesel fuel and fat from animal byproducts. During the initial phase of the changeover, the City used B10 (10% chicken fat) and increased to B20 (20% chicken fat) after the initial 30-day trial with B10. The City will continue to increase bio level use (the B factor) as vehicle performance allows and as the availability of biodiesel dictates.

Not only is biodiesel fuel a more environmentally-friendly alternative to regular diesel fuel, but the City has also realized a cost savings during the initial phase of implementation. The City of Auburn is committed to being good stewards of both your tax dollars and of the environment. We will continue to research "green" alternatives and incorporate them in our daily practices.

6th Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day — Saturday, April 19



The Environmental Services Department will host the City's 6th Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, April 19 from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. at the Environmental Services complex, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. This annual event offers Auburn residents the opportunity to safely dispose of hazardous household chemicals stored at their homes. The City has contracted with Clean Harbors Environmental

Services, Inc. to manage the collection and disposal of chemicals collected during the event.

Participation in Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day is limited to Auburn residential solid waste service customers only. No farm, commercial, or industrial waste, please. Residents are asked to bring a recent water bill to demonstrate proof of residency.

Participants are asked to limit the amount of material they submit for disposal to 20 pounds per household, with individual containers limited to 5 gallons each. Larger amounts must be pre-approved. The City will also collect computers and related equipment for recycling during the event.
