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Downtown Parking: Extreme Makeover Edition *New Metered Spaces to Open on Ground Floor of Parking Deck*

Have you visited downtown Auburn lately? If not, now is the perfect time to come see the changes taking place with downtown parking. In May, the Auburn Municipal Parking Deck received a mini-makeover, including an exterior clean-up and regular maintenance to the deck. In late June, crews also performed regular maintenance and cleaning of the downtown sidewalks.

One of the most exciting changes to downtown is the addition of new metered parking spaces. Over the last year, the City of Auburn has been working to transition leased parking spaces on the ground floor of the parking deck to the 2nd and 3rd floors of the deck as spaces have become available. Effective July 1, the ground floor of the Auburn Municipal Parking Deck will feature all metered parking, providing over 60 additional parking spots for citizens wishing to shop, dine, and conduct business in downtown. The City is also working this summer to improve striping and signage in the parking area adjacent to the deck



In the 2008 Citizen Survey, Auburn citizens identified additional downtown parking as a high priority. With the addition of new metered spaces in downtown and the maintenance of existing spaces, citizens will hopefully ex-

Phase I Drought Watch Continues

Auburn Residents Encouraged to Conserve

As the Southeast's drought continues, Auburn residents are encouraged to conserve water, particularly when watering outdoors. According US to the Drought Monitor's mid-June report, 22.3% of Alabama, including the Auburn area, remains in a severe drought. The Drought Monitor classifies drought areas in five categories: abnormally dry, moderate drought, severe drought, extreme drought, and exceptional drought. While the Auburn area

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remains in a severe drought, statistics are much-improved over last year. By mid-June 2007, 94% of the State was in a severe drought.

Auburn's water supply continues to fare well amidst dry conditions. Residents can help continue this trend by monitoring their household usage and practicing simple and effective water conservation tips. City officials are asking residents to follow a simple guideline when using water: take what you need and use it wisely. Residents are encouraged to continue to employ simple outdoor conservation tips, including:

- Water during efficient water times: before 8 a.m. and after 8 p.m.
- Reposition sprinklers so that water lands only on the lawn and shrubs and not the driveway or sidewalk.
- Mulch effectively around all plants, trees, and shrubs.
 Mulching results in better soil moisture retention and weed control.

Auburn's Phase I Drought Watch remains in effect until further notice. City officials are hopeful that additional rainfall and responsible stewardship of Auburn's water resources will not only prevent the need for a Phase II Drought Warning, but will eliminate the current Phase I Drought Watch altogether.
