

Discover something new at your expanded Auburn Public Library

Back to school time is almost here and for Auburn citizens of all ages that means it's time to hit the books. The Auburn Public Library is excited to welcome the new school year with a brand new 10,000 square foot addition to its facility, in addition to expanded electronic services.

The Library expansion provides Auburn's youngest citizens with a new youth services wing for children and young adult books and programming. The new wing features a programming room for story times, study tables, a children's reading area, an aquarium, and computers available for card catalog use and homework help.



The City of Auburn is keeping pace with the demand for technology with expanded electronic services at the Library. With the addition of the youth services wing,

electronic services has expanded into the former youth programming room. The new electronic services area features thirty-six public access computers available for use, free of charge. Patrons may also access the internet wirelessly from their personal laptop. The Auburn Public Library has featured wireless internet capability since 2005.

Back to School Safety

Auburn City Schools resume classes on Monday, August 11. Citizens are reminded to exercise caution and drive slowly when traveling through school zones, especially between the hours of 7 a.m. - 8:15 a.m. and 2 p.m. - 3:50 p.m. A new traffic signal is expected to be in operation at the intersection of Shug Jordan Parkway and Richland Road in time for the opening of Richland Elementary School, Auburn's newest elementary school. The signal will be operational during school drop-off and pick-up hours only, but will act as a caution light for Shug Jordan traffic at all other times.

Auburn citizens are reminded that Alabama state law requires vehicles to stop for any school bus that is stopped to receive or discharge passengers. This law also applies to opposing traffic even when separated by a median or safety zone.



City Offers Drop Box Locations for Parking Ticket Payments

The City of Auburn now offers citizens two convenient drop box locations for parking ticket payments. A drive-up parking ticket payment drop box has been installed next to the US Mail receptacle in front of the Auburn Municipal Court Building, located at 141 North Ross Street. An additional payment drop box is available for walk-up payments and is located in Downtown Auburn at Toomer's Corner. Envelopes have been provided at each drop box location. To make a payment, please include your parking ticket and payment in the envelope provided.

Drop boxes in these locations are for parking ticket payments only. A separate drop box is available on Tichenor Avenue in front of City Hall for City of Auburn Revenue Office and Auburn Water Works Board payments.


