

City Offers Glimpse of Auburn Via Live Web Cams

The City of Auburn's website now offers citizens and visitors a glimpse of Auburn through its new live web cams. The web cams provide live video feed at intersections throughout the downtown area. Now Auburn fans both near and far can view live footage of Toomer's Corner being rolled. To date, six cameras have been deployed utilizing the City's Wireless Mesh network

Local Site Earns National Recognition Sunny Slope added to National Register of Historic Places

The latest version of the National Register of Historic Places includes yet another piece of Auburn's history. Originally a 2,500 acre plantation, Sunny Slope sits quietly off busy South College Street. This Greek revival raised cottage, built around 1857, was the boyhood home of Governor William James Samford.

Long before Governor Samford's name adorned the famous hall on Auburn University's campus, his father,



William Flewellyn Samford, became a prominent personality in Southern culture. His influential roles included those of newspaper editor, Methodist minister, teacher, politician, and author of many writings that influenced the Southern Secession in 1861. Sunny Slope plantation also served as the headquarters for two gubernatorial races and was a significant training ground for many Confederate soldiers.

The preparatory work for documenting Sunny Slope was an effort spearheaded by the Auburn Heritage Association and the Alabama Historical Commission. Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. and the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) reviewed the nomination research and made a recommendation to the State and the National Park Service that Sunny Slope be added to the National Register.


