

## **Making Auburn a Safer City** The City of Auburn's Comprehensive Approach to Public Safety

A sense of safety and security is a critical component for a high quality of life in any community. Each year, the City solicits citizens' opinions on safety in the community through the Annual Citizen Survey. In the 2008 survey, 94% of citizens were satisfied with Auburn as a place to raise children and 88% of were satisfied with the quality of police and fire services.

While satisfaction with police and fire is typically high, one area where citizens have voiced some concern is with the enforcement of speed limits in neighborhoods. The City has taken great strides to address neighborhood speeding, and citizens have noticed the results. The 2008 survey shows a 7% increase in satisfaction with neighborhood speed limit enforcement. As part of the new budget approved in September, the Auburn City Council authorized the addition of four new police officer positions in direct response to concerns voiced by residents. These officers will be dedicated to traffic enforcement.



Maintaining adequate equipment and facilities is essential to Public Safety's ability to serve citizens and is a top priority of the City Council.



s a top priority of the City Council. The City has recently added a fifth fire station and purchased a 95' aerial platform truck. The new station, in concert with a redesign of the City's fire response zones, enables the Fire Division to maintain an average emergency response time of less than five minutes to



any location within the Auburn city limits. The City has also added an upgraded communications tower, which allows for more efficient and reliable communication for both the Police and Fire Divisions. These expanded communication capabilities facilitate an even closer cooperation with regional public safety agencies. Finally, the Auburn Police Division's newly implemented Mobile Data System allows officers to spend more time in the field and provides them with more resources at their fingertips.

The City of Auburn's responsive and comprehensive approach to public safety will continue as Auburn grows. Fiscal Years 2009 and 2010 will see the addition of new vehicles to the Public Safety fleet, further expansions to the Mobile Data System, and the first phase of plans for a sixth fire station. State of the art technology such as the Auburn Interactive Growth Model, the Mobile Data System, and Auburn's GIS systems will provide City officials with additional information and resources to use in planning for the future and continuing to provide rapid response to emergency situations.

### Auburn's Interactive Government Citizens' Planning Academy Offers Hands-On Experience

Earlier this fall, the City of Auburn's Planning Department hosted the inaugural Citizens' Planning Academy, a six-week curriculum focusing on all aspects of the City's Planning Department. In addition to providing citizens with another way to become involved in their city government, the Academy gives citizens a hands-on, indepth look at the City's comprehensive planning process.

Throughout the Academy, participants studied a number of topics, including the requirements and responsibilities of the Planning Department, the roles and responsibilities of planning-related boards, the City's long-range planning efforts, updates to the comprehensive plan, the role of other City departments in Planning, and zoning enforcement. The Academy concluded with a mock Planning Commission meeting held in the City Council Chamber.

# Holiday Schedules

### Making the Grade... **City Receives Bond Rating Upgrade**

Auburn citizens recently received outstanding news relating to their bond ratings. Standard & Poor's, the world's foremost provider of independent credit ratings, has upgraded the City of Auburn's bond rating from AA to AA+. Auburn and Huntsville are the only municipalities in the State of Alabama to hold an AA+ rating. Out of the more than 28,000 ratings Standard & Poor's assigns to municipalities, counties, states, hospitals, utilities, and boards of education, Auburn's AA+ rating ranks in the top 1% of all S&P ratings.

The new AA+ rating reflects the City's consistent track record of sound financial management, a strong and diversified revenue base, and solid financial reserves. Cities holding such a high rating exemplify excellence in both their financial standing and reporting. The City's current financial plan for Fiscal Years 2009 and 2010 is meticulously outlined in the current Biennial Budget passed by the City Council in September of this year.

"In the midst of these uncertain economic times, Auburn residents can take comfort in knowing that the City's finances remain strong, as evidenced by our rating upgrade," commented Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. "Our citizens expect a fiscally sound municipal government and that is what we will continue to deliver."

What does the rating upgrade mean to citizens? Much like an individual's credit score, a city's bond rating indicates its financial strength and ability to repay debt. Rating agencies such as Standard & Poor's assess the local economy, the City's debt structure and financial condition, and the administrative practices of the City Council and City management in assigning a score.

The 2008 Citizen Survey showed that 74% of citizens were satisfied or very satisfied with the overall value they receive for their tax dollars. Citizens will directly benefit from the rating upgrade in the form of lower interest paid on money the City borrows to construct new facilities or provide additional infrastructure for water, sewer, and roads.
