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

# Your Voice in Auburn's City Government 2009 Citizen Survey Coming Soon

The City of Auburn's mission "to provide economical delivery of quality services created and designed in response to the needs of its citizens, rather than by habit or tradition" presents a clear vision for citizen involvement in government.

City of Auburn officials encourage citizen involvement and embrace transparency in the governing process. City Council and all Board and Commission meetings are open to and well-attended by citizens. These meetings provide an opportunity for any individual to be heard by the City's elected and appointed officials. Currently, more than 100 citizens influence local policy by serving on 20 advisory boards and commissions.

Transparency in government is enhanced and made more efficient through technology. Citizens can find many of the same documents used by the City Council in establishing policy located on the City's website at <a href="https://www.auburnalabama.org">www.auburnalabama.org</a>. The

City's budget document, located at <a href="www.auburnalabama.org/budget">www.auburnalabama.org/budget</a>, details how tax money is spent. Digital copies of meeting packets for the City Council, Planning Commission, and Board of Zoning Adjustment are also available to citizens online at <a href="www.auburnalabama.org/packets">www.auburnalabama.org/packets</a>.

The City's Annual Citizen Survey provides citizens with another valuable avenue to be heard. Now in its twenty-third year, the survey plays an influential role in formulating the City's budget and project priorities, both short and long-term.

The Citizen Survey's impact is evident in a number of ways. The survey consistently shows strong support for Auburn City Schools. In response, the City Council dedicates 13% of adjusted General Fund revenues to the school system, totaling nearly \$7 million for FY2009. These funds play a crucial role in helping Auburn City Schools maintain its status as a quality, nationally ranked school system. Additional initiatives in response to the Citizen Survey include increased neighborhood traffic enforcement, and a continued focus on infrastructure. The priority placed on infrastructure improvements by citizens was important in choosing the projects up for consideration by voters in the forthcoming Special Five Mill Referendum (see inset).

The 2009 Citizen Survey will be administered by mail beginning Friday, January 16. Citizens who receive a copy are asked to take a few moments to fill out the survey and return it in the postage-paid envelope. Citizens unable to return the survey by mail will receive a telephone follow-up survey, providing them with an additional opportunity to participate. Your participation is vital in communicating your priorities to Auburn's elected officials.

#### Special Five Mill Referendum Vote Set for January 27

The Auburn City Council has authorized a special election on Tuesday, January 27 for citizens to vote on the use of proceeds from the Special Five Mill Tax Fund to provide a number of infrastructure, public works, and facility improvements throughout the City. This referendum does not involve the addition of any new taxes, but instead allows voters to approve how existing tax monies are used. The Special Five Mill Tax Fund is supported by a dedicated portion of property taxes set aside each year. By law, proceeds from the fund may only be used to pay for bonds issued for public improvement projects authorized by voters. Funds simply accumulate if they are not used for this narrow purpose. Examples of previous Special Five Mill Tax Fund projects include the recently-completed Auburn Public Library expansion, the City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center, Town Creek Park and Cemetery, and the Auburn Soccer

Projects for the upcoming referendum were chosen based on citizen input via the Annual Citizen

Survey and the priorities of the City Council. By focusing on infrastructure, the City can use accumulated Special Five Mill Tax Funds for essential projects without creating a strain on the General Fund during uncertain economic times.

funds for the entire proposed package of improvements totaling an estimated \$9 million. These projects include:

**High Priority Projects** 

- Donahue Drive/Magnolia Avenue intersection improve-
- FY09 & FY10 Resurfacing and street restriping
- North Donahue Bridge replacement
- Magnolia Avenue resurfacing and installation of raised crosswalks
- Moores Mill Bridge replacement
- Frank Brown Recreation Center renovation (Phase I)

#### **Supplemental Projects**

- Wire Road Bridge replacement
- Wire Road bikeway
- Utility asset mapping and maintenance project
- Fire Station No. 6 (cost of land and design)
- Traffic signal at intersection of West Samford Avenue and Shug Jordan Parkway (pending Alabama Department of Transportation approval)

High priority projects will receive funding without question. Supplemental projects will be added once budgets for high priority projects are set. Pending voter approval, project work will begin immediately and continue into 2010.
