

Change to *Open Line* Publication Schedule

Monthly Sewer Charges and Access Fees to Increase Effective April 1, 2009

At its January 20, 2009 meeting, the Auburn City Council approved an ordinance increasing monthly sewer service charges and system access fees effective April 1, 2009. The changes were recommended in the Sewer Rate and Access Fee Study, conducted by Public Resources Management Group, Inc. (PRMG). The study was commissioned by the Council in April 2008 to assess whether the existing rate and fee structure would support sewer expenditures necessitated by state and federal regulatory mandates as well as system maintenance and capacity needs.



Approximately 40% of current and planned projects are in response to new and changing state and federal regulatory

requirements. As state and federal regulations for the treatment of water discharged from the system continue to become more stringent, costs continue to climb.

Additional projects and expenditures are divided between necessary system maintenance and capacity requirements. The City of Auburn's Sanitary Sewer System is an aging system that requires rehabilitation to maximize its capacity, efficiency, and longevity to serve Auburn's citizens for the foreseeable future. At the December 16, 2008 City Council meeting, a \$25 million debt issue was approved to fund recent and ongoing rehabilitation efforts. Capacity requirements also represent a significant cost to the system. The Northside Treatment Plant is currently at capacity, with the S5 Sewer Project underway to connect the Northside and Southside plants to take advantage of the excess capacity available at the Southside Treatment Plant. New sewer mains are needed to serve areas without public sewer and to prepare for future demand, while some existing lines need to be upsized.

PRMG's recommendations were reported to the Council on December 17, 2008, having found that the existing rate and access fee structure will not support necessary expenditures. The new ordinance, based upon those results, includes rate increases to offset required regulatory and maintenance costs. Typical residential rates will

increase by approximately \$2.55 per month in 2009 and \$3.00 per month in 2010. The new ordinance also includes an increase in one-time sewer system access fees, paid by individuals or contractors



who tie into the City's sewer system prior to the construction of a home or business. The access fee increase will be phased in, with half of the recommended increase in 2009, and half in 2010. The access fee increase helps ensure the costs associated with future growth are not borne by existing customers. The new rate and access fee structure is also designed to help move projects away from funding through debt and toward a "pay as you go" system.

Can We See You?

Bicyclists, joggers, and pedestrians reminded to wear reflective gear

With over 32 miles of bicycle and multi-use paths and 62 miles of sidewalk, it's no wonder Auburn citizens enjoy seeking alternative routes of transportation such as bicycling and walking. When you're out biking, jogging, or walking, don't forget to think safety first. Make sure motorists can see you from a distance of at least 500 feet by wearing reflective clothing between the hours of 30 minutes before sunset until 30 minutes before sunrise.

The City of Auburn requires pedestrians and joggers to wear reflective material between the



waist and shoulders on the front and back for maximum visibility. Cyclists are required to have an operating headlight on the front of their bicycle and reflectors on the front and rear spokes of the wheels and pedals.

Auburn Water Works Board to Switch to Multi-Cycle Billing

In an effort to provide even more convenient and efficient service to its customers, the Auburn Water Works Board (AWWB) will switch to multi-cycle billing effective March 1.

What does this mean for the customer? Currently, all customers are billed once a month, with bills due by the 15th of every month. Beginning in March, you will still be billed once monthly, but your new monthly due date will be determined by your service location.

Why switch to multi-cycles? Under the current system, water bills reflect water usage from six to eight weeks prior. The new cycles will enable customers to receive a timelier picture of their water usage and will assist in identifying costly leaks or excess usage more quickly.

How do I know when to pay my water bill? Customers received an insert with last month's water bill indicating their new bill cycle. Inserts have also been included in this month's bill.

What about automatic payments? If you use an automatic bank draft through the AWWB to pay your bill, your due date will be automatically adjusted. For any other means of payment, including bill pay programs through banks and credit cards, customers will need to adjust their payment date starting with their payment due in March.

State officials will host a Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (DFIRM) Community Coordination Meeting for the City of Auburn on Tuesday, February 24 from 3 p.m. - 6 p.m. in the City of Auburn Meeting Room, located at 122 Tichenor Avenue. The meeting is open to the public.

Printed copies of the proposed maps are available at the Development Services Building, located in the Douglas J. Watson Municipal Complex on Ross Street. Maps will be available for public review Monday - Friday from 7:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Additional information about the FEMA project, as well as an Interactive Map which will help you determine if your property is located within FEMA's proposed flood plain, is available online at www.auburnalabama.org/fema.
