Congressman Mike Rogers Announces Grant for Auburn Fire Division

Recently, Congressman Mike Rogers notified the City of Auburn Public Safety Department - Fire Division of a grant award from the Department of Homeland Security totaling \$76,986. The grant will provide 90% federal funding for a variety of equipment purchases, with the remaining 10% of funding provided by the City. Grant fund equipment purchases include:

• Portable breathing air compressor - The portable breathing air compressor will provide the Auburn Fire Division with the equipment necessary to refill firefighters' air tanks on-site in an emergency situation. Currently, empty air tanks have to be transported back to the fire station to be refilled. The portable compressor also enables firefighters to provide a direct air line to fire suits. This capability will be beneficial



- for firefighters in confined spaces where it would be difficult to maneuver when carrying a portable air tank. · Specialized communications equipment - Specialized communications equipment will be utilized in hazardous conditions where typical communications equipment could cause a spark and ignite combustible gases in the air.
- Voice amplification In a fire emergency, officers must be able to communicate with firefighters and issue orders. Many times, communications are lost due to noise and interference from the firefighter's facemask. The addition of voice amplification allows officers on-scene to communicate with firefighters while those firefighters are wearing their masks and suits.
- Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) packs Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) packs enable rescuers to respond to firefighters who might be overcome by smoke or heat while responding to an emergency situation.

In a previously released statement, Congressman Rogers said, "Lee County's first responders are our first line of defense. I congratulate the men and women of the Auburn Public Safety Department, Fire Division for receiving this grant and hope it will ultimately help increase the safety for all local citizens.'

Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. noted that Congressman Rogers is a "tireless advocate for the safety of Auburn's citizens."

Street Sign Replacement Project

In November 2007, the City Council authorized a resolution for the purchase of aluminum street signs for the City's Street Sign Replacement Project. The project calls for the replacement of the existing concrete posts denoting street names with new blue, reflective signs. The height and reflectivity of the new signs will make them more visible to motorists, especially at night.



City crews began installing the

new signs on streets in the downtown area. The project will proceed outward from downtown until all of the old concrete post street signs have been replaced. Additionally, as new streets are added or old concrete posts are damaged, crews will install the new signs.
