






Governor Riley Names Portion of Highway 280 The Lt. General Hal Moore Highway

Governor Bob Riley recently visited Auburn for an official ceremony naming the portion of Highway 280 between mile markers 98 and 101 the Lt. General Hal Moore Highway. Thanks to an effort spearheaded by Representative Mike Hubbard, this portion of Highway 280 now stands as a tribute to Auburn's own local hero.

Moore retired from the Army in 1977 as a 3 Star General with over 32 years of active service. A longtime citizen of Auburn, Moore dedicated a portion of his retired years researching and authoring the book We Were Solders Once...and Young. The book spent over 17 weeks on the New York Times Bestseller List and is considered a classic on the Vietnam War.



"The fact that this portion of Highway 280 not only runs through Auburn, but also leads to Fort Benning, GA is a fitting tribute to General Moore," said Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. "General Moore truly is an American hero and we are grateful to Governor Riley and Representative Hubbard for ensuring this tribute to his legacy."

East Samford Avenue Extension Opens



Construction of the East Samford Avenue Extension between East University Drive and East Glenn Avenue was completed in May. The road is now open to traffic. The project, totaling \$2.5 million, included extending East Samford Avenue from its previous terminus east of East University Drive to East Glenn Avenue; installation of water and sewer services and other utilities; the addition of two six-foot wide bike lanes; and new traffic signals at East University Drive and East Glenn Avenue.

In the 2009 Citizen Survey, Auburn citizens indicated the management of traffic flow and congestion was their top priority for City officials to address over the next two

years. The completion of the East Samford Avenue extension is expected to help improve east-west traffic flow in the City.

The project, totaling more than \$300,000, included replacing the existing concrete deck, a new drainage system, and new lighting. Work was completed prior to the opening of the 2009 pool season.

FEMA Floodplain Maps and Flood Insurance Study Update

Property Owners in Floodplain Encouraged to Contact Insurance Agent About Flood Insurance

Lee County and the City of Auburn are in the process of updating their Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Floodplain Maps and Flood Insurance Study. Property owners affected by the new proposed floodplain have been notified by mail and are encouraged to contact their insurance agent about purchasing flood insurance. Property owners affected by the new maps will likely face higher flood insurance premiums once the proposed maps are in effect. The proposed maps are tentatively scheduled to go into effect in March 2010.
