

The City's Information Technology Department -GIS Division, with the help of the City of Auburn's Fire Division and student volunteers from this year's Big Event, has photographed and cataloged each of the memorial bricks in the Veterans Memorial, located at 200 N Ross St. This archive is available on the City of Auburn's website



www.auburnalabama.org/maps. The new website allows visitors from around the world to search the Veterans Memorial archive for loved ones by name, by war, by service branch, or by any other text inscribed on the bricks. Users can view these search results, including photographs of the actual bricks and the location of the bricks within the Memorial.

Citizens wishing to honor a member of the military may commission an engraved brick on the honoree's behalf. Orders are filled once a year and installed in time for the Annual Veterans Day Ceremony in November.
