# Auburn Police Chief Retires

The man in charge of public safety for the City of Auburn is retiring after 33 years of protecting the public. Police Chief Frank deGraffenried will retire his badge on May 1st. "I have been blessed to work in a progressive city with tremendous community input and support," deGraffenried said.

The Lee County native began working for the Auburn Police Division as a patrolman in 1977. He later attended Auburn University where he received a bachelor's degree in Business Administration, graduating magna cum laude. In 2003, deGraffenried was named the city's Chief of Police.

"We can all be thankful for the years of service that Chief deGraffenried has provided. His professional leadership and personal demeanor will be missed," said Charles Duggan, City Manager. Among his many accomplishments, the chief was instrumental in the successful merger of the separate police organizations serving Auburn University and the City of Auburn.



He has not only served in law enforcement, but he's also volunteered in the community through a number of service organizations. "There have

been many people who have impacted my life in a positive way, and I just hope that I have done the same for others during my career," deGraffenried said. Perhaps one of his most impactful roles was his decade of service on the local United Way Board, acting as President for two terms. The chief looks forward to spending more time with his wife, Jo and their three children and four grandchildren.

# Lee County Satellite Office Expands Service

Auburn residents will soon be able to renew their driver's license without leaving the city limits. The new Lee County Courthouse Satellite Office, located at 1266 Mall Parkway in Auburn, plans to provide driver's license renewal for Auburn residents in the near future.



The satellite office is a joint venture between Lee County and the City of Auburn. Architectural design services were provided by local architect Randy Wilson. Currently, Auburn residents can pay their property taxes, property assessments and tag renewal fees at the Auburn satellite office. Citizens can obtain a boating registration through the Satellite Office as well as several licenses, including licenses for marriage, hunting and fishing. In the coming weeks, residents will be able to renew their driver's license.

The Auburn Satellite Office not only provides a convenient location for Lee County's fastest growing

City, but also helps relieve the steady customer traffic seen at the County Courthouse in Opelika. It is the County's second satellite office. In 2002, an office was opened in Smiths Station to provide a more convenient service location for customers in the southeastern portion of the county.

The Auburn Satellite Office is one example of the results of the strong partnership between Lee County and the City of Auburn. Currently, the City and County are sharing the cost of the North Donahue Drive Bridge replacement. The City and County are also part of the consolidated jail facility along with the City of Opelika. Each of these partnerships allows both the City of Auburn and Lee County to work more efficiently on behalf of citizens.


