Auburn To Commemorate 10th Anniversary of the Veterans Memorial

November 2010

When the wreath is laid during Auburn's Annual Veterans Day Ceremony this year, it will mark the 10th Anniversary of the Veterans Memorial. The monument was dedicated in November of 2000 on the corner of Ross Street and Glenn Avenue where now more than 700 bricks have been purchased honoring veterans. For ten years, the central feature of the monument has stood to honor those who have served our country, with the lower wall standing in honor of those who have made the supreme sacrifice. Surrounding the monument are brick pavers in honor of individual veterans with ties to members of our community.

On this upcoming Veterans Day, citizens are invited to honor the men and women who have served our country by attending the City's special ceremony at 10:00 a.m. at the Veterans Memorial located at the intersection of Ross Street and Glenn Avenue. A wreath laying will be conducted at the ceremony, which will include performances by the Auburn University Chorus, directed by Dr. William Powell, the Drake Middle School Mixed Choir, directed by Dan Cater, and bagpiper Dan Drummond. Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr., will officiate the ceremony. Immediately following the program, a reception will be held at the Auburn Chamber of Commerce, located at 714 East Glenn Avenue.

Attendees are encouraged to park at Felton-Little Park and the Douglas J. Watson Municipal Complex. Parking for the disabled will be available on Ross Street, between Glenn Avenue and Harper Avenue, which will be closed to through traffic during the ceremony. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held in the City Council Chambers at 141 North Ross Street.

This year, 25 new bricks honoring individual Veterans will be installed in time for the Veteran's Day Ceremony. If you would like to honor a loved one who served with a brick paver at the Memorial, new bricks are available for immediate purchase to be installed in time for Veterans Day 2011.
