A Guided Tour to a World of Information at Your Fingertips

The City of Auburn's Award Winning Website

Whether you have a desktop in your home office, a laptop near the couch, or a smartphone in your pocket, if you are an Auburn resident you are probably "connected". According to our latest Annual Citizen Survey, 88% of Auburn residents have Internet service in their homes. Of those, 95% use high-speed or broadband Internet. To serve such a connected community, the City of Auburn provides easily accessible, online access to the information that Auburn citizens want and need.

The City of Auburn's website at www.auburnalabama.org is always available for citizens; a virtual annex to City Hall providing information at the click of a mouse. By making crucially important government documents available to all, the transparency of Auburn's government is enhanced. From the budget document to the zoning ordinance, and with information from every City department, the City's website houses 670 pages of information available to anyone with an Internet connection. The entire City Council packet, not just the agenda and minutes, is available online for citizen review days before the City Council meeting. Through Auburn's website, citizens can receive press releases as quickly as the media.

The front page, or home page, of the City's award winning website is a dynamic, go-to destination for the most current information about Auburn. The content on this page provides timely information on items of interest to citizens, including traffic announcements, holiday pickup schedules for trash and recycling, program announcements for Parks and Recreation and the Public Library and breaking news and events related to the City. Additionally, this page offers glimpses of life in "the loveliest village" portrayed through a series of photos which scroll along the top of the page.

The front page of the City's web site is a portal to all of the information available online. With a color scheme that's true to Auburn, the orange buttons on the left help you navigate the section of the site that you're



in, while the blue buttons at the top provide drop-down menus to take you anywhere on the web site. The right side of every webpage contains icons which link to key areas of interest. Just a click away from the front page are links to City Council and City Department contact information, links to information about the City's various boards and commissions, links to the current and archived Open Lines, links to job vacancies with the City, links to the Annual Citizen Survey results and much more.

Of special interest to Auburn's citizens and visitors are the City's six web cams, which include a camera pointed squarely at the century old Live Oak trees on the University side of Toomer's Corner. These cameras let you watch what is happening in downtown Auburn. You can catch the post-game celebrations at Toomer's Corner, monitor downtown traffic conditions and enjoy the activity during downtown events. These cameras are available for viewing 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The City of Auburn requires local cable operators to set aside a channel for government use. Locally, Channel 16 is set aside for use by the City of Auburn. In support of the Auburn community's commitment to education, the City of Auburn currently makes this channel available for programming originating from Auburn City Schools. This programming is broadcast simultaneously to Auburn's website and can be found online at www.auburnalabama.org/tv. So when you are away from a TV but still want to watch what is happening on Channel 16, look no further than the City's website.

The City's award winning GIS Division continues to enhance the mapping services offered online. In 2010, the Veterans Memorial Brick Archive application was launched. This is an interactive map showing the location of every brick installed around the Veteran's Memorial monument in honor of veterans with connections to Auburn. A similar application will soon be launched mapping the downtown Tiger Trail, which honors the greats in Auburn athletics. Be among the first group to know when this application is released by subscribing to the City's e-Notifier (described below).

In early 2011, the City of Auburn will take new aerial photography of the area. These photographs will be integrated with the general interactive map currently on the maps website. It is on this map that citizens can view aerial photography (current aerials are from the 2008, 2005, 2002 and 1997 projects), parcel lines, property ownership, property tax information, school zones, voting wards, zoning information and more.

The Maps section of the website also includes the new Street Routing Map, which can help plan the best route by car or by bicycle in and around Auburn, taking into account the most current information on local road closings and construction. The Public Service map on this site provides garbage collection days, voting locations, the school district, fire stations, and the fire station(s) that would respond to an address in case of emergency. Keep an eye on the City's Maps page as the GIS Division continues to innovate to find practical tools to help citizens and visitors.

For those who wish to learn about what's happening in Auburn as it happens, the website houses an email notification system called the e-Notifier. Citizens can go to www.auburnalabama.org/enotifier and sign up to receive immediate updates on news, traffic detours, and various educational and recreational events from Parks and Recreation and the Auburn Public Library. E-Notifier subscribers choose which categories to follow, allowing emails you receive to be tailored to your individual interests.

Dog Tag Renewal

All dogs over 3 months old kept within the City of Auburn are required to have a City license. The annual fee for all spayed or neutered dogs is \$5.00; the license fee for all other dogs is \$15.00. Dog licenses are renewed each calendar year, due January 3, 2011. To avoid a late penalty, renewals should be completed by January 31, 2011. Auburn Public Safety Kicks Off Annual Toys for Tots Drive

The City of Auburn Department of Public Safety kicked off the 2010 Toys for Tots drive on October 5. The program is designed to assist families in the Auburn community by providing Christmas gifts to needy children ages one through ten.

Anyone wishing to register a child to receive a gift can do so no later than November 30 at the Auburn Police Division at 141 North Ross Street on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. To be eligible, a parent or legal guardian must provide a picture ID, the child's social security card or birth certificate, and two of the following three documents: current light bill; water bill; or lease agreement.

Anyone wishing to donate to Toys for Tots can drop off a gift at any Auburn Fire station or the Auburn Police Division. Thanks to the generosity of Uncle Bob's Self-Storage, two remote drop off points have also been established at their stores located at 1231 Gatewood Drive and 2020 South College Street.

The gifts must be new but do not need to be wrapped. Helpers will place the gifts into age appropriate categories before delivery, which is scheduled during the week before Christmas. During these tough economic times all donations are extremely important. Remember, no gift is too small.

City of Auburn Makes Major Road Improvements

A number of road construction projects have been underway this Fall to improve the traffic infrastructure in Auburn:

- A left turn lane, an additional thru lane, and a right turn lane have been added to East University Drive at Shelton Mill Road. Motorists traveling eastbound on EUD now have the benefit of a dedicated left turn lane, right turn lane, and two thru lanes. The same improvements have been made to the westbound portion of East University Drive at Shelton Mill Road. A dedicated turn lane has also been added at Dekalb Street, a right turn lane has been added at Dean Road, and a right turn lane has been installed at Stoker Avenue.
- Turn signal changes have been made to improve traffic flow at the intersection of East University Drive and Opelika Road. Previously, vehicles could only make left turn movements during the green arrow signal for a protected turn. Vehicles will still have a protected left turn available, but are also able to turn left on green when traffic conditions permit.
- The segment of Glenn Avenue from Dean Road to East University Drive has received a new asphalt surface and temporary striping. Permanent striping has been delayed due to a national shortage of the chemical material used to manufacture thermoplastic traffic markings, and will be installed as soon as possible.
- A traffic signal was added to North College Street at Shelton Mill Road, with portions of North College Street and Shelton Mill Road receiving new asphalt surfaces and temporary striping.

The joint City/County project to replace the Donahue Road Bridge continues, with an estimated completion date of Spring 2011.
