

Too Much Phosphorus Can Impact Local Water Quality

Spring is the time of year when many residents will begin their annual lawn fertilization program. It is recommended that residents have a soil test performed prior to any fertilizer application. The soil test will verify whether a fertilizer application is warranted. The soil test may reduce fertilizer cost and can also assist with protecting water quality in local watersheds. Fertilizers are generally comprised of nitrogen, phosphorus and potash. For more information concerning soil tests, please contact the Soil Testing Laboratory at Auburn University at www.aces.edu/anr/soillab or call 844-3958. The average cost of a soil test is \$7.00 per sample and usually takes approximately 3 to 5 days to get results.

Over-fertilization of lawns leads to the runoff of nitrogen and phosphorus into local watersheds. Water quality impacts associated with this nutrient-rich runoff include the creation of algae blooms which can lower dissolved oxygen levels, threaten aquatic habitats, lead to fish kills, decrease water clarity, increase water treatment costs and impair recreational uses such as boating, fishing and other water sports.

If a fertilizer treatment is necessary for your lawn, please do the following in an effort to protect our local watersheds:

- Select a fertilizer based on the recommendations of your soil test.
- When applying fertilizer, please select a slow-release fertilizer, use the recommended application rate and follow the instructions for application.
- If you live along a stream or lake, try to maintain a natural buffer zone between your lawn or garden and the stream or lake.
 This buffer zone will protect water quality by allowing excess fertilizers and chemicals to be absorbed into the soil in lieu of entering the stream or lake.

2011 Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

Environmental Services will host its 9th Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, April 9, 2011 from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m. at the Environmental Services Complex, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. Last year's event was a success with the participation of 288 Auburn citizens who responsibly disposed of or recycled varied hazardous chemicals, materials, computers and related equipment.

Citizens may bring up to 20 pounds of materials per household for disposal. Proof of residency can be shown by bringing a recent water bill. Participation is limited to Auburn residents. No farm, commercial, or industrial waste is permitted.

The television dramas make it looking thrilling, but for the men and women who work in Auburn's Public Safety Department, public safety is a major responsibility that's part of everyday life. This Spring, citizens are invited to experience firsthand the inner workings of police, fire, emergency communications and codes enforcement as part of the 2011 Citizens Public Safety Academy.

The academy is a free program offered to area citizens, ages 18 and older, involving "hands-on" activities such as firearms training and CPR certification. Each week a variety of public safety professionals will discuss various topics in the academy. Topics will include, but are not limited to crime scenes, polygraph use, hostage negotiation, fire prevention, and codes enforcement.

The first session of the *Auburn Public Safety Academy* begins on Thursday, March 31, 2011 with graduation being held on May 12, 2011. Six of the sessions meet on Thursday evenings from 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and two sessions are held on Saturdays, 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.
