City of Auburn Receives State Planning Award

Auburn, Ala. - The City of Auburn received the "Outstanding Planning Award for a Comprehensive Plan" for its *CompPlan 2030* at the Annual Meeting of the Alabama Chapter of the American Planning Association held on February 16th in Mobile, Alabama. "This acknowledgment is very much appreciated and something for which we can all be proud," said Forrest Cotten, Planning Director.

CompPlan 2030 is the City of Auburn's plan for future growth and development, focusing on land use, now and in the future, including consideration of projected future needs for schools, parks and other public facilities, as well as the transportation infrastructure that ties everything together. The City of Auburn Planning Department employs advanced modeling, via its Auburn Interactive Growth Model (AIGM), that was formally put in place in 2008 to dynamically project growth patterns and how changes in population or land use in one area can affect the City as a whole.

"It was a true collective effort of the City with all of the City's Departments being involved and making valued contributions in many different ways," said Cotten. *CompPlan 2030* was adopted by the City Council in October 2011 after a lengthy review process involving the Planning Commission, Planning staff, and the citizenry. 2012 Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

The Environmental Services Department will host its 9th Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, April 14, 2012 from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. at the Environmental Services Complex, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. Last year's event was a success with the participation of 288 Auburn citizens who contributed varied hazardous chemicals, materials, computers and related equipment for recycling and/or disposal.

Citizens may bring up to 20 pounds of materials per household for disposal. Proof of residency can be shown by bringing a recent water bill. Participation is limited to Auburn residents. No farm, commercial, or industrial waste is permitted. Below are items that are acceptable as well as those items that will not be accepted:

"Travel With Care" Safety Tips

This Spring, the City of Auburn, Auburn University, the Auburn Police Division, and the Lee County Sherriff's Office are presenting a transportation safety awareness campaign sponsored in part by Big Dog Running Company. Each year, the campaign focuses on emphasizing a new, but relevant transportation safety message. Some of the most misunderstood traffic laws in Auburn are those pertaining to bicyclists and those pertaining to nighttime visibility. Bicyclists have the same rights as motorists and fare best when they act and are treated as vehicles. Even where it is legal to ride on a sidewalk, studies show that it is safer for a bicycle to ride on the road as opposed to the sidewalk.

All traffic signs and rules apply to bicyclists. If riding at night, bicyclists should have a headlight bright enough to be seen at a distance of at least 500 feet away. A red reflector on the rear of the bicycle should be visible for a distance of at least 300 feet. While these rules should be strictly followed by bicyclists, drivers of automobiles should be cognizant of bicyclists at all times as it's their right as a fellow traveler. The Auburn City Council passed an ordinance in October 2011 requiring motorists passing bicyclists to give cyclists three feet of clearance.

Nighttime visibility is not only important for bicyclists, but also walkers and joggers. National statistics show that almost fifty (50%) percent of pedestrian fatalities occur between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and midnight. City Ordinance requires all walkers or joggers walking or running during hours of darkness to wear reflective material between the waist and shoulders on their front and back that give an indication of the walker's or jogger's presence through reflected light from the head lamp beams of motor vehicles at a distance of a minimum of five hundred (500) feet. A white shirt is not enough; reflective materials are necessary to meet the law.

Most people think that if they can see the headlights of a car approaching, the driver in that car can see them too. However, the reality is that eight out of ten drivers who struck people at night didn't see them. Studies show that walkers or joggers in dark colored clothing during nighttime hours are first seen approximately



55 feet away. A driver traveling at 25 mph needs over 150 feet to stop safely. Wearing reflective materials or lights when traveling, by foot or on bike at night, is necessary for your safety. Being seen is not just smart, it's the law.
