Governor Grants Funding for Moores Mill Road Resurfacing

The City of Auburn will resurface Moores Mill Road between Dean Road and Samford Avenue thanks to a state grant through the Alabama Transportation Rehabilitation and Improvement Program (ATRIP).

The Alabama Department of Transportation will provide funding of approximately \$1 million for the project, reducing the expenditures by the City of Auburn to approximately \$250,000. As part of the resurfacing project, two additional turn lanes will be added to Moores Mill Road at the intersection of Dean Road to improve traffic flow. An existing culvert will be replaced to help reduce flooding and guardrails will be upgraded to current standards to improve safety.

The resurfacing project was previously scheduled for 2015 due to its high expense. With resources available to resurface the road sooner, the City can better respond to current roadway conditions and prevent the need for a major rebuild of the roadway in the future.

The Moore's Mill project is one of 105 projects throughout the State funded through ATRIP. Governor Bentley first unveiled ATRIP, the state's largest road and bridge improvement program to date, in February. The

grants awarded were part of the first phase of ATRIP grants with at least two more phases anticipated.

The City of Auburn thanks Governor Robert Bentley and Speaker of the House Mike Hubbard for their support of this significant road improvement project. Safe Routes to School

With school starting back up in just weeks, many students will soon be rushing out the door each morning with their backpack slung across their shoulder and their lunch box in hand. This fall, even more students in the Auburn community will be able to walk or bike to school. The City of Auburn is adding approximately 3,000 linear feet of sidewalk to the existing sidewalk that connects to Cary Woods Elementary School. The additional sidewalks will be constructed to connect to Cary Woods Elementary School along Sanders Street, North Cary Drive, Petrie Road and Lunsford Drive.

The recent sidewalk addition in the Cary Woods neighborhood was made possible by a grant provided by the Alabama Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program which enables more children in Grades K-8 to safely walk and bike to school. The Alabama Department of Transportation apportioned the City of Auburn \$150,000 as part of the Alabama Safe Routes to School program.

This is the second year the City of Auburn has received grant funding through the SRTS program since it was initiated in 2008. Last year, the City of Auburn was provided grants to construct sidewalks in areas surrounding Auburn Early Education Center, Cary Woods Elementary School, Richland Road Elementary School, Dean Road Elementary School, Ogletree Road Elementary School and on a stretch of South College Street.

In all, the City's ongoing sidewalk projects will encourage child pedestrian safety, exercise and relieve traffic congestion in schools zones.

Sales Tax Holiday

As students head back to school this fall, Auburn's parents will enjoy savings on many back to school necessities. The Auburn City Council approved an ordinance authorizing Auburn's Sales Tax Holiday Weekend at the May 15, 2012 City Council meeting. The Sales Tax Holiday will begin Friday, August 3 at 12:01 a.m. and end on Sunday, August 5 at midnight.

Items exempt from state and city sales tax fall into 3 major categories:

Clothing – All human-wearing apparel suitable for general use is exempt unless it otherwise appears on the taxable list; clothing items must cost \$100 or less per article of clothing to be exempt.

Computers, Computer Software, and School Computer Supplies – A single purchase with a sales price of \$750 or less will be exempt. Exempt items include computers, computer software and any item commonly used by a student in a course of study in which a computer is used.

School supplies – Any items of \$50 or less per item commonly used by a student in a course of study will be exempt. Supplies may include art supplies, reference maps and globes, textbooks on an official school book list with a sales price of more than \$30 but less than \$50, and books with a sales price of \$30 or less per book. An all-inclusive list of exempt school supplies may be found on the City's web site at <u>www.auburnalabama.org</u>.

Items <u>not</u> exempt during the Sales Tax Holiday Weekend include:

- Clothing accessories such as handbags, jewelry, sunglasses, umbrellas.
- Protective equipment such as breathing masks, hard hats, helmets, and safety belts.
- Sports or recreational equipment such as athletic gloves, goggles, shin guards, ballet or tap shoes.
- Any systems, devices, software, or peripherals designed or intended primarily for recreational use, video games.
- Magazines, newspapers, periodicals, or any other document printed or offered for sale in a non-bound form.
- Furniture

How Many Roommates Can I Have? A Reminder of the City of Auburn's Residential Occupancy Regulations

Each fall, Auburn welcomes thousands of new and returning students. In the annual citizen survey, 82% of residents feel that students have either a positive or neutral impact on their neighborhood. In an effort to maintain the character of singlefamily neighborhoods, the City of Auburn sets forth limitations regarding residential occupancy in the City limits. Traditional residential neighborhoods are typically zoned to allow for no more than two unrelated persons residing at an address. Apartment complexes, mobile home parks, and other multi-family housing units are properly zoned to allow for more than two unrelated tenants.

Not sure if you or your neighbor are in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance? Visit the City's website at <u>www.auburnala-bama.org/students</u>. The site contains links to the occupancy limitations map, the City's Geographic Information System (GIS) site, a brochure highlighting specific information on the City's occupancy limitations, and information on how to report suspected residences in violation of occupancy regulations. Residential occupancy brochures are also available at the City of Auburn Planning Department, located at 171 North Ross Street, Suite 100.

Property owners found to be in violation of occupancy regulations are subject to fines and possible jail time as set forth in the City of Auburn Zoning Ordinance. Residents in violation of residential occupancy regulations may be subject to eviction by property owners.
