#### **2012 Road Construction Progress Report**

Every three years, the City of Auburn's Public Works Department evaluates all of the 275 miles of roadways in Auburn. The rating received for each stretch of road is used as a factor in prioritizing projects for the City's five-year resurfacing plan. In addition to annual resurfacing projects, Public Works targets special road projects with the goal of improving traffic safety and traffic flow on Auburn's roads.

#### **Completed Projects**

**I-85 Interchange** - As of this writing, the Alabama Department of Transportation has indicated that Auburn's third interchange with Interstate 85 is scheduled to be completed in early December, 2012. The new interchange will provide improved access to Auburn Technology Park West and will provide a new route for football traffic in the Fall, potentially alleviating congestion throughout the City.

**West Glenn Avenue Road Widening Project** - The City of Auburn completed construction on West Glenn Avenue, widening the road from two lanes to three lanes by adding a center turn lane from Donahue Drive to Wright Street. The project included wider sidewalks and newly striped crosswalks along West Glenn Avenue. The completed project was designed to improve pedestrian safety and help alleviate traffic congestion downtown.

**Hamilton Road Resurfacing and Bike Lanes Project** - The Hamilton Road Resurfacing Project included widening and resurfacing Hamilton Road from just north of Moores Mill Road to the Auburn City limits. The street now includes bicycle lanes and a left turn lane servicing Bent Creek Road and Hamilton Hills Drive.

**2012 Streets Resurfacing and Restriping Project** - The 2012 Streets Resurfacing Project included resurfacing the following streets: Country Club Drive, Florence Drive, Hillcrest Drive, Martin Avenue, McKinley Avenue, North Ryan Street, South Ryan Street, South Heritage Court, and Moore Alley. The 2012 Streets Restriping Project consisted of restriping markings and lane lines at various locations throughout the City.

**Safe Routes To School Sidewalk Project** - The City of Auburn added approximately 3,000 linear feet of sidewalk to the existing sidewalk that connects to Cary Woods Elementary School. The sidewalks will connect to Cary Woods Elementary School along Sanders Street, North Cary Drive, Petrie Road and Lunsford Drive. The recent sidewalk addition was made possible by a \$150,000 grant provided by the Alabama Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program which invests in infrastructure that enables children in Grades K-8 to safely walk and bike to school.

**Samford Avenue Sidewalk Rehabilitation Project** - The City of Auburn replaced the pedestrian bridge on Samford Avenue over Chewacla Creek. The new bridge was constructed using 3 recycled concrete bleacher sections that were removed from Duck Samford Stadium renovations in 2004. Also, a new handrail was installed and the sidewalk on either side of the bridge was repaired.

#### **Ongoing and Miscelleaneous**

In 2012, The Public Works Department engaged in a number of ongoing projects to maintain our streets and improve traffic flow and navigation in the City:

- Public Works replaced 468 of the old concrete street signs with new, more visible street signs.
- New, lighted streets signs were placed throughout downtown
- Messaging boards to improve awareness and safety near campus were installed on Magnolia Avenue
- Traffic light cabinets were rewired at several intersections to improve traffic light efficiency and performance
- Public Works "crack-sealed" 20.84 miles of roadway to extend the useful life of roads not ready to be resurfaced

# Road Construction (Continued) Looking Ahead – 2013 Projects

Moores Mill Road Resurfacing and Bridge Replacement Project - The City of Auburn will resurface Moores Mill Road between Dean Road and Samford Avenue thanks to a state grant through the Alabama Transportation Rehabilitation and Improvement Program (ATRIP). The Alabama Department of Transportation will provide 80 percent of the funding for the project. As part of the resurfacing project, left turn lanes will be added on Moores Mill Road at the intersection of Dean Road to improve traffic flow.

In another project, the Moores Mill Bridge will be widened to remove a bottleneck during peak traffic hours. Construction could begin in late 2013.

**South College/ East University/Shug Jordan Intersection Improvements** - The City of Auburn will widen all approaches to the intersection of South College Street with East University Drive/Shug Jordan Parkway, including the addition of dual left turn lanes

and right turn lanes. The project will help improve traffic flow at one of Auburn's most congested intersections.

South College Street and Longleaf Drive Intersection Improvements Project- Phase 2 - City of Auburn will widen the west side of College Street at this intersection and West Longleaf Drive to accommodate dual left-turn lanes onto College Street and onto East Longleaf Drive. The project will also consist of overlaying the entire intersection with new asphalt. The project will help traffic flow in the area.

**North College Street Sidewalk** - This project will complete a missing segment of sidewalk along North College Street. The project will include the construction of a 5' wide sidewalk on North College Street from Drake Avenue to North Cedarbrook Drive. This project will create a continuous sidewalk for students traveling to the new elementary school.

**Tech Park West Lane Extension -** The City of Auburn will construct a new roadway from Auburn Technology Park West to Cox Road. This project will tie into Auburn's new interchange (Exit 50) and will provide enhanced interstate access to industries locating in Auburn's Technology Park West.

**Shelton Mill Road -** The City of Auburn will resurface Shelton Mill Road from College Street to just south of the entrance to Copper Beach Townhomes.

#### **Ongoing and Miscellaneous 2013**

In addition to the projects completed in 2012, the Public Works Department will continue in 2013 to resurface roads by priority, to maintain roads through crack-sealing and other measures, to improve signage throughout the City and to work in response to the priorities of citizens and elected officials to alleviate traffic congestion and increase traffic safety for all of Auburn's residents and visitors.

Two vacancies on the **Board of Zoning Adjustment** will be announced at the December 4, 2012 City Council meeting and will be filled at the January 8, 2013 City Council meeting.

## City of Auburn Awarded Harvard-Kennedy Bright Ideas Designation

The City of Auburn has received a "Bright Ideas" designation from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University for its multi-phased information technology system that integrates internal and external data into a map-based system. The Bright Ideas initiative highlights noteworthy and promising government programs and practices from across the nation to serve as a catalyst in the adoption of innovative ideas by government entities.

The City of Auburn's Information Technology Department was recognized for its work in consolidating data into a visual webbased tool that provides a more accurate picture of daily and emergency operations and improves safety and performance among first responders. The solution leverages multiple real time data systems within an interactive geographical information systems (GIS) map at minimal cost and without changing the data providers' business practices.

Jim Buston, Assistant City Manager and Chief Information Officer, said "the recognition is a true honor coming from such a prestigious organization" and that the Information Technology Department will continue to be at the forefront of helping deliver innovative and cost effective services to the citizens of Auburn.

City of Auburn public safety professionals use the system to analyze response times, crime areas, fire events, and traffic incidents easily categorized by location, type or severity. Sex offender data is accessible to police through the system, greatly simplifying the analysis and notifications needed to locate a registered sex offender in a particular area. In addition, the application is integrated with Auburn University's facility management software, providing first responders access to campus floor plans and associated information. Future work will include integration of live camera feeds, emergency equipment locations, room capacities, and other relevant campus information.

The Ash Center for Democratic Governance and Innovation is the branch of the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University that fosters creative and effective government problem solving and has developed a marketplace of ideas and examples of government innovation. The City of Auburn's Bright Idea will be highlighted on the Ash Center's Government Innovator's Network, advancing the opportunity for it to be adopted by other municipalities in addition to being considered for the Innovations in American Government Award.

#### **Grease Recycling**

If your holiday plans include frying a turkey, don't pour the leftover grease down the drain. Recycle it through the City of Auburn's Cooking Oil/Grease Recycling Program. To participate, simply pour any used cooking oil (after it has cooled) into its original container, secure the lid making sure it is leak free, and drop off the container at the RecycleAuburn Drop-Off Center, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. While you're there, pick up a new, empty container for future use, courtesy of the City of Auburn. Properly disposing of used cooking oil/grease is good for the environment and helps prevent costly sewer blockages and potential sewer spills.
