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

# City of Auburn Receives 'Quality of Life Award'

The City of Auburn has been selected to receive the 2012 Quality of Life Award from the Alabama League of Municipalities (ALM). Auburn wins for the category of Cities larger than 50,000 in population, the largest of three size categories in the annual competition. The City is being recognized for its use of Geographic Information Services (GIS) to enhance public engagement as part of its effort to modernize FEMA flood maps.



A key element in the City of Auburn's successful completion of this project was not only fulfilling FEMA requirements, but also engaging citizens during the map modernization process. Auburn officials wanted to utilize every tool at their disposal

to reach out to as many citizens as possible. In addition to the traditional community meetings and the paperbased public notifications, the City of Auburn's Information Technology Department, Geographic Information Services Division, created an interactive, web-based mapping solution to allow the public to browse both the current and proposed flood plain maps and to see proposed changes as they happened throughout the process.

The resulting GIS data allowed residents to use proposed flood plain layers on the map to visualize the changes to their property, and to view the data in relation to other GIS layers including parcel lines and aerial photography. This interactive map was deployed on the City's existing website, allowing for easy access and a sense of continuity and familiarity for users. Map navigation was made intuitive by adopting common trends in webbased map navigation. By using industry standard controls, such as one-click navigation and autocompleting searches, users spent less time learning how to use the map and more time studying proposed changes.

The City's response in exceeding the Federal Government's mandate with the FEMA flood maps project is an example of how the City of Auburn's GIS technologies can be used to provide information to citizens and how technology provides citizens with tools for providing government input. As technology continues to advance, these tools can only help our local government be more transparent, open and responsive. The ALM Award will be presented to the City of Auburn at the league's annual convention during May 19-22, 2012.

# **Travel with Care 2012**



The 2012 Travel with Care transportation safety campaign launches Monday March 19<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 am with a kick-off celebration on the lawn of Samford Hall. Travel With Care is an awareness campaign that encourages safe and courteous habits for all modes of transposition including walking, cycling, and driving. The campaign aims to educate citizens on the laws and rules established to enhance the safety of all road users.

This year's campaign is a partnership of the City of Auburn, Auburn University, Auburn Public Safety, and the Lee County Sheriff's Office. The campaign will include increased enforcement and education of traffic and safety issues such as nighttime visibility, jaywalking, proper passing of transit and school busses, and the new "give me 3" law for passing cyclists. The campaign will also feature free giveaways and prize packs.

# City of Auburn Supports Smart Yards Incentive Program

The Saugahatchee Watershed Management Plan (SWaMP) is pleased to offer the Smart Yards Incentive Program to City of Auburn residents located in the Saugahatchee Watershed in the northern region of Auburn. The Smart Yards Incentive Program is made possible through a partnership between the City of Auburn and SWaMP, and is funded by an EPA Region 4 watershed restoration grant awarded by the Alabama Department of Environmental Management.

Through the Smart Yards Incentive Program, qualifying Auburn residents can apply for funding for landscape improvements to reduce stormwater runoff from their property. These improvements, also recognized as stormwater best management practices, can include rain gardens, bioswales, stream bank or riparian zone restorations, and other stormwater runoff management improvements. There projects not only benefit your property but can benefit other properties while perserving our water resources.
