

bama Polytechnic Institute in Auburn to begin his college career in 1941. In 1943 he entered the U. S. Army as a Private E-2. After completing the competitive exams, he was awarded a congressional appointment to the United States Military Academy at West Point. LaMar served with the 73rd Battalion in the U. S. 7th Infantry Division during the Korean War. After more than 25 years spent traveling the world, he returned to Auburn University to serve as Professor of Military Science for four years before retiring from the U. S. Army and making the Auburn area his permanent home.

This year marks the first Auburn Heroes Remembered Award that will be presented to the family of a local distinguished veteran who has passed away. This year's Auburn Heroes Remembered Award will be given in honor of Edward R. Schowalter. Colonel Schowalter began his military career at the Virginia Military Institute and upon graduation he was commissioned in the U. S. Army. He was awarded the Medal of Honor during the Korean War for actions taken while serving as commander of Company A, 31st Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division. Upon completing his military service he made his home in Auburn, Alabama.

Immediately following the breakfast, at 10 a.m., the City of Auburn will hold a memorial wreath laying ceremony at the Auburn Veterans Memorial Monument, located at the northeast corner of Ross Street and Glenn Avenue. Ceremony attendees are encouraged to park at the Douglas J. Watson Municipal Complex and Felton Little Park. During the ceremony, Ross Street will be closed from Glenn Avenue to Harper Avenue to allow for parking for the disabled.

City Grants Trash Amnesty May 21-25

Just in time for spring cleaning, the Auburn City Council has approved the City's 8th Annual Trash Amnesty Week for the week of May 21-25, 2012. During Trash Amnesty Week, the fees normally assessed to residents for the collection of oversized yard debris and other bulky waste will be waived. Citizens are asked to pay close attention to the following guidelines when placing items out for collection:

Debris should be properly placed at the curb no later than 6:00 a.m. on your regularly scheduled collection day. Please avoid placing items on or near mailboxes, utility boxes, poles, or other fixed objects. All items should be properly contained or bundled so they do not fall into the street or down storm drains. White goods tags are not required during Trash Amnesty Week.

The City will accept yard waste, appliances, and bulky items for collection. No household garbage, hazardous waste, or other unacceptable waste should be placed out for collection with debris. Debris should not be placed in the roadway, on or around storm drains, near utility lines, on utility boxes, or on vacant lots. Limbs and other debris should be no longer than 5 feet in length. To facilitate wood debris and metal recycling efforts, please separate all wood debris, including limbs and grass clippings, from metal items.

Due to the large volume of debris expected during Trash Amnesty Week, citizens may experience a delay in the collection schedule. Every reasonable effort will be made to maintain the established collection schedule.

Parking Fees

In March, the Auburn City Council approved changes to the City's parking regulations, designed to provide for improved parking administration and enforcement in the downtown area. Changes include increasing the fine for parking tickets from \$5.00 to \$10.00, provisions for towing vehicles with excessive unpaid parking fines, and allowing the City Council to authorize a parking ticket amnesty period from time to time to help resolve outstanding parking fine issues. The new parking ordinance also provides for new parking meter technology including the use of credit cards and for installation of multi-space parking meter stations in lieu of single space mechanical meters.

The City's parking ordinance is designed in part to enhance the availability of downtown parking to assist downtown businesses and visitors alike. For example, downtown parking regulations have long restricted some metered spaces to two-hour parking during business hours to encourage turnover. Because downtown parking is vital to downtown businesses and restaurants, the Auburn Chamber of Commerce received a copy of the ordinance before its passage so that the business community would have a chance to comment.

If you're parking downtown, please remember that there's more public parking than just what you see on-street on College Street, Magnolia Avenue and Wright Street. Behind Toomer's Corner is a public parking area accessible from both Gay Street and Tichenor Avenue. In total, you can find 372 metered spaces downtown, with additional parking available for lease. Downtown metered parking is free after 5 PM, on weekends, between Auburn University semesters and on official holidays. Additional parking spaces become available for public use after business hours and on weekends in the City parking lot next to the AuburnBank drive through on Gay Street.

Increasing downtown parking has been a long-term effort. In 2009, a long-term plan for downtown parking improvements was presented to the City Council. Among the improvements completed so far are renovation of the downtown parking deck including improved lighting and security cameras, and improvements to the City Hall parking lot. In January, Auburn citizens voted to use money from the five-mill fund for further downtown improvements. These proposed parking improvements were developed in response to citizen input including the Annual Citizen Survey, a scientific poll focusing on the priorities and approval levels of Auburn residents. In the most recent poll, downtown parking was tied with road resurfacing as a top transportation infrastructure priority for Auburn citizens.

As a result of the five-mill referendum, other parking improvements are in the planning stages including:

- Funding for further planned improvements, increasing the number of parking spaces downtown by over ten percent and improving metered parking surrounding the downtown parking deck.
- Demolition of the AuburnBank drive-thru and consolidation of all surface parking on Gay Street along with new landscaping.
- Repaving and landscaping the west parking lot located behind Toomer's Drugs and all of its access drives.
- Enhancing pedestrian access to and from the downtown parking deck and surface lots, including enhanced lighting, signage and security features.
