Veterans Day 2012

Citizens are invited to attend the City of Auburn's commemorative ceremony to be held at the Auburn Veterans Memorial on Monday, November 12, beginning at 10:00 a.m. The event will include a wreath laying along with performances by the Auburn University Choir directed by Dr. William Powell and music from bagpiper Dan Drummond. Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. will officiate. Immediately following the ceremony, a reception will be held at the Auburn Chamber of Commerce, located at 714 East Glenn Avenue.

Attendees are encouraged to park at Felton-Little Park and the Douglas J. Watson Municipal Complex. Parking for the disabled will be available on Ross Street, between Glenn Avenue and Harper Avenue, which will be closed to through traffic during the ceremony. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held in the City Council Chambers at 141 North Ross Street.

Surrounding the monument are brick pavers in honor of individual veterans with ties to members of our community. This year, 13 new bricks honoring individual veterans will be installed in time for the Veterans Day Ceremony. If you would like to honor a loved one who served, new bricks are available for immediate purchase to be installed in time for Veterans Day 2013. Commemorated as Armistice Day beginning November 11, 1919, the day on which we now honor veterans became a legal federal holiday in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day, a holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars.

Auburn Recycles Day Shredding and Electronics Recycling

The City of Auburn's Environmental Services Department - Recycling Division, in partnership with the Auburn Chamber of Commerce, East Alabama Shredding and Security, and CompuPoint USA LLC., will host a FREE Secure Document Shredding and Electronics Recycling Day on Friday, November 16, 2012 from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. at the Auburn Chamber of Commerce parking lot, located at 714 East Glenn Avenue.

The event provides citizens, businesses and non-profits the opportunity to properly dispose of outdated, unwanted or broken electronics and the opportunity to destroy documents safely and securely. Businesses will be limited to four archive size boxes of documents for the shredding event. NO HAZARDOUS WASTE will be accepted. Contractors will only be accepting electronics for recycling and paper documents for shredding. This event will be held rain or shine.

Auburn residents may recycle their electronics year-round at the City of Auburn Environmental Services Department's main office, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. Computer-related equipment and televisions smaller than 19" are accepted by appointment only. Televisions 19" and larger may be left at curbside for collection. To make an appointment, contact the Environmental Services Department.

Auburn Public Safety Kicks Off Toys for Tots Toy Drive

The Season of Giving is upon us and the Auburn Department of Public Safety has kicked off its 2012 Toys for Tots toy drive to help get you in the spirit of giving. Toys for Tots assists Auburn families in need by providing Christmas gifts to children ages 3-8.

Child registration began October 2 and will continue at the Auburn Police Division each Tuesday and Wednesday from 10:00-11:00 a.m. The deadline to register is November 14. To be eligible, a parent or legal guardian must provide a picture ID, the child's social security card and birth certificate, and two of the following three documents: current light bill; water bill; and/or lease/rental agreement.

Citizens wishing to donate to Toys for Tots are invited to drop off their gift(s) at any Auburn Fire station or at the Auburn Police Division at 161 North Ross Street. Thanks to the generosity of Uncle Bob's Self-Storage, two remote drop points have also been established at their stores located at 1231 Gatewood Drive and 2020 South College Street. The gifts must be new and are not required to be wrapped. Upon arrival, they will be organized into age-appropriate categories before delivery which is scheduled for the week prior to Christmas.

The Toys for Tots initiative represents a great opportunity for our community to reach out to those in need in order to make this Christmas a joyous holiday for each and every child. Remember, no gift is too small.

Collection carts and recycled materials must be placed on the curb by 6 a.m. on your scheduled collection day. Please avoid placing items on or near storm drains, mailboxes, utility poles, or other fixed objects. All items should be properly contained or bundled so they do not fall into the street or down storm drains. All carts and collection bins must be removed from the curb by 6:00 a.m. the following day.

City Launches New and Improved GIS Interactive Map

The City of Auburn's Information Technology Department has released a new version of the City's web-based interactive map. This new map program, simply titled the COA Interactive Map, will take the place of the existing General Interactive Map. The new COA Interactive Map provides citizens with access to the same data used daily by City staff and elected officials and provides citizens with a simplified, intuitive map interface that is easy to use and understand. The new COA Interactive Map contains all of the features of the old General Interactive Map plus new data layers and a variety of new and useful controls for finding and displaying a wealth of information.

Residents can use the map to see their parcel lines and property information; determine their voting ward, voting location and City Council representative; determine their school district; show their proximity to flood plains and much more. The tool is easy to use, but to help residents discover all the information available at their fingertips, the City of Auburn's Information Technology Department will host two free seminars for the public. Residents will have a hands-on opportunity to learn how to use the mapping system and discover all of the features and information available through this innovative tool.

Grease Recycling

If your holiday plans include frying a turkey, don't pour the leftover grease down the drain. Recycle it through the City of Auburn's Cooking Oil/Grease Recycling Program. To participate, simply pour any used cooking oil (after it has cooled) into its original container, secure the lid making sure it is leak free, and drop off the container at the RecycleAuburn Drop-Off Center, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. While you're there, pick up a new, empty container for future use, courtesy of the City of Auburn. Properly disposing of used cooking oil/grease is good for the environment and helps prevent costly sewer blockages and potential sewer spills.
