## **GE Aviation Celebrates Factory Opening in Auburn**

GE Aviation recently celebrated the grand opening of its new jet engine components factory, expected to create hundreds of jobs in Auburn.

Joining GE Aviation President and CEO David Joyce for the opening ceremony were Governor Robert Bentley, Alabama House Speaker Mike Hubbard and Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr.

The 300,000-square-foot advanced manufacturing plant will produce precision, super-alloy machined parts for GE

jet engines that will power future commercial and military aircraft, and will support the vast fleet of GE jet engines already in service. GE expects to hire 50 employees by the end of 2013. The facility could ultimately represent an investment of \$75 million in the State of Alabama, with 300 to 400 people employed when the plant is at full ramp-up later this decade.

"The opening of this facility will lead to more good jobs for the people of Alabama," Governor Robert Bentley said. "Alabama has the best workforce you can find, and our role in the aviation industry continues to grow. I appreciate the investment GE Aviation is making in Alabama. On the state and local levels, we are committed to helping GE Aviation succeed here in Auburn."

GE Aviation selected Auburn in large part because of its access to a skilled work force and its proximity to Alabama's university system. GE has partnered with Alabama Industrial Development Training (AIDT) to develop pre-employment training programs, with Southern Union State Community College (SUSCC) handling a portion of pre-employment training. To develop a pipeline of young talent, GE has worked with Auburn University and Tuskegee University to create internship and co-op opportunities for students.

The Auburn facility will manufacture high-pressure turbine (HPT) airfoils and is expected to deliver its first parts later this year.

### Forbes Ranks Auburn/Opelika in Best Small Cities for Jobs

Forbes.com has ranked the Auburn/Opelika Area 10th on this year's list of America's best small cities for jobs.

Forbes ranked 398 metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs), including 241 MSAs with less than 150,000 jobs. Rankings were based on employment data over more than a decade, growth trends and "the region's momentum." Forbes cites economic diversity, affordability and quality of life as key to job creation.

Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. said "This couldn't be a better follow-up to what our citizens told us in the Annual Citizen Survey. We've been working for decades to build a diverse, stable economy and rankings like this are a testament to the success of that approach. In Auburn, Alabama, we're dedicated to creating job opportunities and maintaining our excellent school system and quality of life."

Other recent Forbes rankings include the #6 "Best Small Place for Business and Careers in the U.S." in 2010, "#1 in Projected Job Growth in the U.S." in 2009 and the "6th Fastest Growing Small Metro in the U.S." in 2008.
