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2014 Municipal Election

Auburn residents in Ward 1 (District 1, Post 1), Ward 3 (District 2, Post 1), Ward 5 (District 3, Post 1) and Ward 6 (District 3, Post 2) will go to the polls on Tuesday, August 26th to elect their representative on the City Council for the 2014 - 2018 City Council term.

Since there is no opposition in the Mayor's race or the races for Ward 2, Ward 4, Ward 7 or Ward 8, there will be no election held in those wards.

The polls will be open at the following locations from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM on Tuesday, August 26, 2014:

Ward 1 (District 1, Post 1) - Boykin Center Gymnasium Ward 3 (District 2, Post 1) - Frank Brown Recreation Center Ward 5 (District 3, Post 1) - Dean Road Recreation Center Ward 6 (District 3, Post 2) - Dean Road Recreation Center Absentee Box

- Auburn City Hall

As unopposed candidates, Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr., Ward 2 Councilperson Ron Anders, Ward 4 Councilperson Brent Beard, Ward 7 Councilperson Gene Dulaney and Ward 8's new Councilperson, former Police Chief Tommy Dawson, will be elected by resolution and presented certificates of election at the August 5th Council meeting. Their oath of office ceremony will take place along with the rest of the newly elected City Council on Monday, November 3, 2014.

Voting Locations



Voter Registration


Voter registration is governed by state law and the federal National Voter Registration Act. The deadline to register to vote is Friday, August 16th. Voters must have resided within the City limits for at least 30 days to vote in the Regular Municipal Election.


Voter registration forms can be obtained at Auburn City Hall at 144 Tichenor Avenue in Auburn, at the Lee County Board of Registrars Office at 215 South 9th Street in Opelika, or online at http://www.sos.state.al.us/elections/ GetRegForm.aspx. Registration forms should be returned to the Lee County Board of Registrars Office at PO Box 1530, Opelika, Alabama, 36803-1530. Registration forms returned to the City will be forwarded to the Lee County Board of Registrars.


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Absentee Voting

If you are unable to vote at the polls on election day, you may apply for an absentee ballot if you meet any of the following conditions:

- If you will be out of the county on election day.
- If you have a physical illness or disability that prevents a trip to the polling place.
- If you are a registered voter living outside of the county, such as a member of the armed forces, a voter employed outside the United States, a college student, or a spouse or child of such a person.
- If you are an appointed election official or poll watcher at a polling place other than your regular polling place.
- If you work a required shift of at least 10 hours that coincides with polling hours.

How to Apply

The City will accept applications for absentee ballots through Thursday, August 21. Applications may be obtained from City Hall. Applications for absentee ballots must be made in writing to the City Manager and either hand-delivered or mailed to:

The application form must be signed by the applicant and must state the applicant's name, residence address, information necessary to verify the applicant as a registered voter, and the address to which the ballot should be mailed. As soon as ballots are printed, absentee ballots will be mailed to those persons who have made a proper application.

Business Emergency or Medical Emergency applications can be made after the absentee deadline but no later than 5 PM on the day before the election, if the voter:

- is required by an employer under unforeseen circumstances to be out of the county on election day for an emergency business trip, or
- has a medical emergency requiring treatment from a licensed physician

The **business emergency application** contains an affidavit acknowledging that the voter was not aware of the out-of-county business trip prior to the normal absentee ballot deadline. The **medical emergency application** requires that the attending physician describe and certify the circumstances as constituting an emergency.

Absentee Voting Deadline

An absentee ballot returned by mail must be postmarked no later than the day prior to the election and received by the Absentee Election Manager no later than noon on election day. If hand-delivered, the ballot must be in the office of the Absentee Election Manager by the close of business at 5:00 p.m. on the day prior to the election.



New Fitness Centers Now Available to Citizens

Auburn Parks and Recreation is pleased to announce the opening of two new fitness centers inside the Frank Brown Recreation Center and the Boykin Community Center for citizens to utilize for their wellness needs. The new fitness centers are the result of improvements made at the Frank Brown Recreation Center as part of the Five Mill Referendum approved by Auburn voters in 2012. The project included the construction of a new fitness center at Frank Brown, allowing equipment from the former fitness area to move to Boykin Community Center. Access to both fitness centers is available to individuals ages 19 & up who live or work in Auburn. Teens ages 16 - 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian to work out. Access is not available for anyone under the age of 16.

Boykin Fitness Center

The Boykin Fitness Center is a FREE fitness option for citizens 19 & up living or working in Auburn. Enjoy a cardio room with treadmills, elliptical machines, and upright bikes; free weights; and a strength room. Stop by the front desk at the Boykin Center Gymnasium to complete your registration form and waiver prior to your first workout. Patrons must sign in at the front desk prior to every workout.

Frank Brown Fitness Center

The new Frank Brown Fitness Center features a cardio room with treadmills; cross trainers; and recumbent, upright, and upper body ergometer bikes. Free weights offer an opportunity for toning, while the new strength room includes multipress, hip abductor/adductor, leg extension/curl, leg press, chin/dip/leg raise, and back extension machines.

Citizens living or working in Auburn can enjoy all of this for a one-time fee of \$25 for a facility access and identification card. To obtain an access card, simply complete an application and bring it to the Frank Brown Recreation Center (for check payments only) or the Harris Center (for cash and credit card payments) during regular business hours. Once your payment and application have been received, City staff will take your photo for your membership/access card. Cards will be ready within 48 hours of application; however, you may begin using the fitness center as soon as your application is completed and payment has been received. Adventures in Art 2014: Upcycled!

The Adventures in Art program will be held Sept. 8 - 11 at the Donald E. Davis Arboretum and the Julie and Hal Moore Center for Excellence. Adventures in Art is a field trip component of a community-based, art education program for all fourth and fifth grade students from Auburn City Schools.
