

Library Introduces Zinio

This October, the Auburn Public Library launched Zinio, a new service that allows library card-holders to download digital magazines to their computers, tablets, and mobile devices. Zinio for Libraries is provided by RBdigital, a division of Recorded Books.

The library's Zinio collection offers more than 70 titles for checkout, covering a variety of topics such as current events, interior design, cooking, travel, fitness, business, finance and technology. Among the most popular titles are Better Homes and Gardens, Newsweek, National Geographic, and The New Yorker.

To access Zinio, select the "Access Digital Magazines" link on the library's website (www.auburnalabama.org/library) and, using your library card number, follow the on-screen instructions to create accounts with Zinio and RBdigital. Once the accounts are created, check out individual magazine issues through the Zinio website and read them either in your web browser or with a Zinio mobile app. You can also sign up for email notifications when new issues of your favorite magazines become available. You can download as many issues of as many magazines as you like, and keep them indefinitely. The service is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Within its first month of availability, library cardholders downloaded more than 350 digital magazines through Zinio. The launch of this service continues the Auburn Public Library's digital collection development. In 2011, the Auburn Public Library began offering patrons downloadable

e-books through OverDrive. Within the past year, the library's circulation of e-books has doubled, even while circulation of print materials has held steady.
