

#### Your Guide to the New Corner (Part 2) LED Lights

Since the Corner re-opened in August, many of you have asked about the LED lighting on signal poles, under seat walls and along the curbs. The lights were added as a feature of the Corner Construction project to enhance safety and provide ambiance at the corner. The LED flood lights (mounted on the traffic signal poles) will be used only when the streets are closed and the regular overhead lights can be turned off. The ground, seat wall and flood lights will display appropriate theme colors for events including Auburn University Home football games, major holidays and celebrations, as well as local events. The ground lights will be white Sunday through Thursday nights as an added measure to help clearly delineate the pedestrian areas from the traffic lanes.

The seat wall lights will be white on Friday and Saturday nights to provide additional lighting for larger weekend crowds downtown.

The LED lights initially ran in a test mode, with colors rotating to ensure that they worked properly and to achieve "burn-in," allowing the LED lights to maintain a consistent color scheme at different locations. With testing completed, the lights will not continue to rotate colors and will only be used as described above.



#### Auburn's New Alleyways

The new Corner is all about creating a pedestrian friendly atmosphere and sense of place at one of Auburn's most iconic locations. In that spirit, Auburn's two primary alleyways have seen a major up-

grade to achieve better lighting, enhance pedestrian safety and to improve the aesthetic of these key passageways between downtown businesses and downtown parking. In addition to improving underground water and sewer infrastructure, the Magnolia and College Street alleyways have seen extensive improvements to create even walking surfaces. New lighting and the removal of the roof above the College Street alley all help create a more open, inviting and safe walkway for pedestrians.

#### **Trees to Return this Fall**

The major visual change that remains for downtown is the planting of trees around the new intersection. There are eleven tree wells around the intersection where trees will be planted this fall to complete the look and feel of the new Corner. Until then, the location of the tree wells are currently marked by large planters throughout the downtown area. Trees will be planted between the various seat walls to provide shade, and will be strategically placed to protect the view of the corner. For example, the view from the AU corner lines up directly across the tiger paw to Toomer's Drugs and will now be framed by the new trees.

A team of landscape experts from the City of Auburn, Auburn University and the Auburn Tree Com-

mission chose Princeton Elms to complement the look and feel of the Corner. The tree wells have the same Silva-Cell technology used for the Auburn Oaks to provide room for root growth and to maximize the health of the trees.

#### Frying a Turkey for the Holidays? Recycle your grease through the City's Cooking Oil/Grease Recycling Program

If your holiday plans include frying a turkey, don't pour the leftover grease down the drain, recycle it through the City of Auburn's Cooking Oil/Grease Recycling Program. To participate, simply pour any used cooking oil (after it has cooled) into its original, leak-proof container and drop it off at the RecycleAuburn Drop-Off Center, located at 365-A North Donahue Drive. While you're there, pick up a new empty container for future use, courtesy of the City of Auburn. Through this program, approximately 5,378 gallons of used cooking oil have been recycled since March 2009.

On August 1, 2011, the City of Auburn's Water Resource Management Department added a curbside grease recycling element to the program. If you would like to utilize the curbside service, or would like to find out more information about this program, please call the Water Resource Management Department at 501-3069 to schedule a free curbside collection.

Please help us keep Auburn's sewers clean by taking advantage of these programs to dispose of household cooking oil and grease in the proper manner.
