During the ceremony, Ross Street will be closed from Glenn Avenue to Harper Avenue to allow for ADA accessible parking.

All items should be properly contained or bundled so they do not fall into the street or down storm drains. All carts and collection bins must be removed from the curb by 6 a.m. the following day.

Irrigation Meters

Spring is here and the Water Works Board of the City of Auburn would like to remind its customers that irrigation meters are available for watering your lawn or garden. Charges for water usage through irrigation accounts are not tied to sewer fees, lowering the cost of watering. There are setup costs involved, as a standard ¾ inch irrigation meter will typically cost approximately \$1,500, with other charges that may apply based on location and other details. Building a home is the ideal time to install an irrigation meter, but if you plan to stay in your current home and if you regularly water you lawn or garden, an irrigation meter may save you money. Auburn/Opelika a Top Small Metro for Attracting Business

The Auburn-Opelika Metro was named a top ten metro under 200,000 for attracting businesses by Site Selection magazine. In Alabama, both Decatur-Morgan County and Auburn-Opelika were named on the list. Auburn-Opelika tied for sixth place with Lima, Ohio, while Decatur-Morgan County tied for ninth place with Burlington, North Carolina.

The rankings are based on the number of projects announced in 2015, with 10 attributed to Auburn-Opelika.

For Auburn's part, industrial locations and expansions continued at a healthy pace in 2015. Local industry and job growth included seven new or expanding industries which are expected to generate a combined 297 jobs with a combined capital investment of \$77,214,400.

White Goods Tags No Longer Required

At the March 22nd City Council Meeting, Council members passed an ordinance rescinding the requirement that residents purchase a "white goods" tag to affix to appliances before disposing of them. The change allows the City's Environmental Services Department to pick-up appliances such as dishwashers, microwaves, water heaters, etc. at the curbside with no white goods tag and no additional cost to customers.

Effective immediately, Auburn residents simply need to place appliances at the curb on their regular garbage and recycling pickup days for them to be picked up.

Trash Amnesty Week May 16-20

During the spring, many Auburn residents work to beautify homes and yards. During the week of May 16-20, 2016, fees normally assessed to Auburn residents for the collection of oversized yard debris and other bulky waste will be waived to accommodate these "spring cleaning" needs. Residents are asked to abide by the following guidelines when placing items out for collection:

- Debris should be placed at the curb no later than 6:00

 a.m. on your regularly scheduled collection day. Please
 avoid placing items on or near mailboxes, utility boxes or
 poles, or other fixed objects. All items should be properly
 contained or bundled so they do not fall into the street
 or down storm drains.
- The City will accept yard waste, appliances, and bulky items for collection. No other waste materials, including household garbage or hazardous waste, should be placed out for collection with debris.
- Limbs and other debris should be no longer than 5 feet in length.
- To facilitate recycling efforts, please separate all wood debris, including limbs and grass clippings, from metal items.

Every reasonable effort will be made to maintain the established collection schedule but due to the large volume of debris expected during Trash Amnesty Week, citizens may experience a delay in their collection schedule.
