

#### Plastics recycling returns, single-stream recycling begins Dec. 4

We are excited to announce the return of plastics recycling as we kick off single-stream recycling on Dec. 4!

Years of public input and planning and months of intensive work and preparation will culminate in the launch of Auburn's new singlestream recycling program, which will allow customers to place all recyclables in one 95-gallon cart.

The 5,600 residents making up the first phase of the program may begin placing carts at curbside for collection on their regular scheduled garbage collection day beginning the



week of Dec. 4. All residents, whether they are part of the initial rollout phase of the program or not, may resume plastics recycling the same week.

Those not included in the first phase may recycle through the sorted curbside program for cans, paper and plastics. Bags will no longer be provided for curbside plastic recycling, but residents may sort plastics into bins, milk crates, boxes or other containers for pickup. Plastics will also be accepted at the Recycling Drop-Off Center at 365-A N. Donahue Drive.

Acceptable single-stream materials are:

- Aluminum cans
- Flattened cardboard
- All types of paper
- Plastic: #1-7, including plastic bottles and food containers; no plastic bags or toys
- Steel and tin cans

Glass, Styrofoam and other materials not listed above may not be recycled through the singlestream program since they contaminate the single-stream recycling sorting process. We will continue accepting glass at the Drop-Off Center.

The program will begin with 5,600 carts. Visit auburnalabama.org/garbage-and-recycling for a full list of areas that will be included in the initial rollout. Environmental Services has contacted all property owners who will be included in the first phase of the program.

If you live in an area included in the first phase but wish to opt out of the program, please call (334) 501-3080. The City will reassign carts for households that opt out and plans to expand single-stream recycling to all interested customers as quickly as funding allows.

The decision to switch to single-stream recycling was the result of resident input and an ongoing analysis of best recycling practices. Direct input from residents and data from the annual

Citizen Survey revealed that residents did not want to sort their recycling. In 2017, the City applied for and received a \$288,000 grant to help implement single-stream recycling.

Because of its convenience, curbside recycling programs that transition to the single-stream method tend to see increases in participation at a faster rate than programs that do not use single-stream. One Alabama city that recently made the transition to single-stream carts realized an increase in participation of 26 percent and material recovery of roughly 40 percent.

The program will also lower the cost of recycling compared to our former source separation method. The larger, automated collection trucks used for single-stream require fewer employees to operate, increase worker safety and improve route efficiency. Single-stream recycling also decreases landfill disposal costs by decreasing household garbage.

#### Holiday recycling tips

Recycling your **Christmas tree** is as easy as placing it at the curb. The City of Auburn Environmental Services Department will collect and recycle Christmas trees during customers' weekly curbside collections.

Don't forget to **recycle the boxes** from your gifts this holiday season. Cardboard boxes and gift boxes are included in our curbside recycling program and may be recycled at the Recycling Drop-Off Center, located at 365-A N. Donahue Drive. Please break down all boxes before placing them for recycling.

Before frying or baking those hams and turkeys this season, pick up a free container from the Drop-Off Center to **recycle the used cooking oil** rather than pouring it down the drain.

Though it may seem harmless, letting grease and cooking oil run down the drain is the main cause of sewer back-ups. Instead, simply pour any used, cooled cooking oil into a leak-proof container and bring it to the Drop-off Center or place it by the curb for recycling. To schedule a free, curbside grease recycling pickup, call the Water Resource Management Department at (334) 501-3069.

Through this program, approximately 7,753 gallons of used cooking oil have been recycled since March 2009. Please help us keep Auburn's sewers clean by taking advantage of these programs to dispose of household cooking oil and grease in the proper manner.



# Take a ride with the War Eagle Bike Share program

Have you noticed the "Free Bike Parking" signs popping up around downtown and at Auburn's parks? We're excited to bring you the War Eagle Bike Share (WEBS) program now open to all in Auburn.

Auburn University introduced the bike share program last year for students. This summer, the City of Auburn partnered with Auburn University to expand the WEBS program to all Auburn citizens, promoting bicycling as an alternative mode of transportation.

Through this partnership, the City funded the purchase of 10 bikes, 12 bike racks for 11 new hub locations and nine repair stands. There are now 53 hubs spread through campus, downtown and at Auburn Parks and Recreation facilities.

The WEBS program is free to all users for the first two hours, and each additional hour is \$5. To reserve a bike, participants can sign up on Gotcha Bike's mobile application, online at app.socialbicycles.com or directly from the bike using its keypad. Once a ride is reserved, users simply enter a 4-digit PIN code to unlock the bike and begin their ride!

Users can travel anywhere with a WEBS bike but must return the bike to a designated hub location to avoid additional fees. Users will be charged a \$50 fee for locking the bike outside of the system area and a \$5 fee for locking the bike at a non-designated hub location. **Did you know?** The City of Auburn began a free Bicycle Loaner Program in 2009 that allows citizens and visitors to borrow a bicycle and helmet for up to two weeks. We also have a pedal assist bike, or e-bike, that is great for those new to cycling or considering commuting by bike. ## **Free Holiday Parking**

Parking will be free this holiday season from Monday, Dec. 18, 2017, through Tuesday, Jan. 9, 2018. Parking can be found along downtown streets, on and surrounding the first floor of the Auburn Municipal Parking Deck and in the Gay Street Parking Lot.

#### **Business License Renewals**

Any business providing services or selling goods within the Auburn city limits is required to have a City of Auburn business license. City business licenses for 2017 expire on Dec. 31 and must be renewed by Thursday, Feb. 15, 2018, to avoid late fees.

All current business license holders will receive renewal packets in late December. Any business that does not receive its renewal packet by Dec. 31 should contact the Revenue Office to verify its mailing address and request another packet.

The City Revenue Office is located in City Hall at 144 Tichenor Ave. Business hours are Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. except City holidays. For more information, contact the Revenue Office at (334) 501-7239 or revenue@auburnalabama.org.
