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## **Auburn a Best Performing Small City**

Auburn once again ended the year on a high note in the news media. In December, a front page story in the print edition of the Wall Street Journal heavily featured Auburn and our Economic Development efforts, including some of Auburn's major industrial recruitment successes, such as GE Aviation. The article touches on the City of Auburn's long-term economic development strategy of recruiting a diversity of small to mid-size, technology based, value-added companies to enhance economic stability.

Further demonstrating the success of that strategy, the City of Auburn moved up four spots to number 6 on the Milken Institute's 2016 list of Best Performing Small Cities. According to the Milken Institute, their annual Best Performing Cities report provides "an objective benchmark for examining the underlying factors and identifying unique characteristics of economic growth in metropolitan areas." Milken's criteria include job creation, wage gains and technology developments.

AL.com did a December story on Wallethub's ranking of the best college towns in America. This ranking was based on the local economy, social amenities such as local nightlife and restaurant choices and academic and career opportunities. Auburn ranked 45<sup>th</sup> among all college towns and 32<sup>nd</sup> among small college towns, "with its highest marks for economic and job opportunities."



#### **Drought Warning, Water Restrictions Continue**

November and December brought rain back to Auburn after almost a month without a drop. Despite the much needed rainfall, the City of Auburn continues to be in a Phase II Drought Warning with mandatory water restrictions in effect. The City of Auburn Water Works Board (AWWB) escalated the existing Phase I Drought Watch to a Phase II Drought Warning on November 3, 2016, due to the effect of drought on the available water supply and a long range forecast that continued to predict below normal rainfall. By November 28, Auburn had endured a 42 day stretch with only trace amounts of rain.

While the City of Auburn received significant rainfall in November and December, the AWWB estimates that approximately 10 to 15 inches of additional rainfall is needed over the next 3 to 4 months to recover from the drought. The AWWB will continue to monitor our water resources and weather conditions over the next few months to ensure that water levels recover to a point that they're ready to provide for the increased water demands of spring and summer.

The U.S. Drought monitor provides weekly updates on drought levels throughout the nation. After Auburn's Fall showers, most of Lee County was reduced from "Exceptional Drought," which is the most severe category, to "Extreme Drought."

# Help Wanted: Auburn Boards and Commissions

There are many ways to serve the community, from volunteering at a non-profit to serving on one of the City's Boards and Commissions. Currently there are 117 residents serving on Auburn's 21 Boards and Commissions.

These boards serve a variety of purposes. Some are independent authorities, such as the Water Board, Industrial Development Board and Board of Education. Others serve in an advisory capacity to city officials such as the Planning Commission, Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, Tree Commission, Historic Preservation Commission and Greenspace Advisory Board. In some cases, the City Council appoints members to boards of multi-governmental agencies, including the East Alabama Mental Health-Mental Retardation Board, the Indian Pines Recreation Authority, the Lee County Youth Development Center and the Metropolitan Planning Organization Citizen's Advisory Committee.

Each time there is an upcoming appointment on a board or commission, the city manager announces the vacancy at a City Council meeting approximately one month prior to the appointment being made. Vacancies are also announced each month in this newsletter. The full membership of every board and commission, including the expiration date of each member's term of service, is listed online at auburnalabama.org/boards.

In 2017, in response to the City Council's desire to make sure that every resident who wants to serve knows about available vacancies, we'll expand our advertising of announcements to include the City's social media and eNotifier, in addition to Open Line and the City's web site. There will also be an application form available by request and posted on the City's website at auburnalabama.org/boards.

## Northwest Auburn Neighborhood Plan Public Meeting #3

The final public meeting for the Northwest Auburn Neighborhood Plan will be held on Tuesday, January 31, 2017 at 6 p.m. at the Boykin Community Center, 400 Boykin Street.

The goal of this planning initiative is to develop a Neighborhood Plan that encourages redevelopment where appropriate, improves the streetscape along Bragg Avenue and MLK Drive, provides for increased pedestrian connectivity throughout the plan area and protects the single family fabric of the neighborhood from encroachment by student housing developments.

The plan will likely yield strategic land use and zoning amendments, as well as projects to improve landscaping, sidewalks, lighting and other amenities. Ultimately, the Northwest Auburn Neighborhood Plan will be a guide for enhancing the neighborhood's attractiveness and vitality while maintaining its heritage and character.
