Summer Downtown Improvement Projects 2017 This summer, we're taking advantage of the lighter traffic to upgrade decades old infrastructure

downtown. This maintenance work will help ensure that the water and sewer infrastructure is sound and is ready to meet the needs of downtown Auburn's future. As work continues this summer, here's what you can expect downtown in the coming weeks.

Wright Street Improvement Project Phase 1 (Work underway): Work on the Wright Street Improvement Project continues, with on-street parking and sidewalks closed in the area where work is underway.

Sidewalk, parking and lane closures are expected to occur on Glenn Avenue and the north end of Wright Street as construction on The Evolve student housing project continues. As work on the 191 College student housing project begins, lane closures near the intersection of West Glenn Avenue and North College Street will occur.

South College Street Lighting (June): Streetlights in the center island on South Col-



lege Street between Magnolia Avenue and Thach Avenue will be replaced, requiring lane closures on South College Street between Magnolia Avenue and Thach Avenue.

Toomer's Corner (June): Expect lane closures at Toomer's Corner as maintenance is performed on intersection brickwork installed during the Corner Construction project. The work schedule is still to be determined as Open Line goes to press.

North College Street @ Mitcham Avenue (June): Maintenance to the traffic light at the intersection of North College Street and Mitcham Avenue will include lane closures affecting the intersection, with closures on North College Street between Mike and Ed's and Bragg Avenue. The work schedule is still to be determined at press time.

Glenn Avenue and Ross Street Resurfacing

(June): Resurfacing on Glenn Avenue between Ross Street and Dean Road, and including the intersection of Glenn Avenue and Ross Street, will necessitate lane closures on both streets.

Gay Street and Magnolia Avenue Traffic Signal (June or July): Replacement of the traffic signal at East Magnolia Avenue and Gay Street will necessitate lane or intersection closures while work is underway. The project will include installation of new decorative poles and mast-arms matching the style of Toomer's Corner.

Auburn University – Mell Street/Thach Avenue/South College Street Reconfiguration (June & July): A reconfiguration of Mell Street, Thach Avenue on campus and the intersection of Thach Avenue and South College Street will bring lane closures on campus, including the intersection of South College Street and Thach Avenue.

Parking Deck Rehabilitation (June & July): Maintenance to the Municipal Parking

Fourth of July Holiday Schedule

City Hall will be closed on Tuesday, July 4 in observance of the Independence Day holiday. Public Safety services, including Police, Fire, and Communications will remain on their regular schedules. The collection of garbage, trash, and recycling the week of July 3rd-7th will change as follows:


Collection will be delayed one day for customers whose normal collection day is Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday.

The garbage collection schedule for all holidays in 2017 is posted online at www.auburnalabama.org.

The first Council meeting of July will be held on Wednesday, July 5 instead of Tuesday, July 4 due to the holiday. Committee of the Whole will be held at a time to be announced (usually 6:55 p.m.) followed by the regular City Council Meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber located at 141 North Ross Street. Deck will require temporary parking closures in the deck. Work will be phased so that all three floors are not closed at the same time. Maintenance is designed to ensure the deck remains safe until its eventual replacement.

Logistics and Advertising: The City of Auburn will coordinate each of the City projects listed here with each other to mitigate the overall traffic impact as much as possible. Please note that all dates are dependent upon weather and other factors and are subject to change.

Phase I Drought Watch

The City of Auburn remains under a Phase I Drought Watch. Despite spring rains, the water level in Lake Ogletree continues to be lower than normal as a result of the lake being artificially drawn down to facilitate the ongoing construction of the Lake Ogletree Spillway. Once the project is complete later this summer, Lake Ogletree will have an increased water storage capacity, further strengthening the resiliency of our water supply against drought.

The Phase I Drought Watch includes voluntary water restrictions including:

- Only irrigate between 8:00 PM and 8:00 AM.
- Even numbered addresses should only water on Monday, Wednesday or Friday.
- Odd numbered addresses should only water on Tuesday, Thursday or Saturday.

Television and Monitor Recycling Ends

Due to the fees charged by electronics recycling processers, the City of Auburn is no longer able to accept televisions and computer monitors for recycling. Computer equipment and electronics that are not televisions or monitors may be recycled, but an appointment must be made as these items require special handling. Please contact the Environmental Services Department at 501-3080 for an appointment to drop off your computer equipment. If you have televisions or computer monitors that you need to dispose of, place those items at curbside for collection along with your other trash.

2016 Consumer Confidence Report

Each year the Water Works Board of the City of Auburn (AWWB) distributes its Consumer Confidence Report (CCR). The purpose of this report is to notify all customers about the quality and safety of their drinking water. The CCR provides customers with information about the contaminants that may be found in their drinking water, and how these contaminants may affect their health. The CCR is also a tool to educate customers about drinking water sources, treatment techniques, and delivery methods used to ensure compliance with State and Federal laws. The AWWB now utilizes electronic delivery, whereby each customer is directly notified about where to access a digital copy of the CCR and how to request a paper copy. The AWWB provides a digital copy of the CCR online that can be viewed at the following web address: www.auburnalabama.org/wrm/ccr/2016. Customers may also request a hardcopy of the CCR.
