



## City Launches New Online App To Show Construction Permits

The City of Auburn has launched an online app allowing Auburn residents to view all outstanding construction permits in the city limits. This new tool is provided in response to requests by citizens for more information to be available on growth and development in Auburn. Visitors to the application will find a map of Auburn with red pins showing the location of active permits. Each red pin is clickable, revealing the basic details of the project.



Permits are required for construction projects in all types of uses, including commercial, industrial and residential. The permit map is refreshed daily to show all active permits

throughout the City. The map is searchable by address, street, parcel, subdivision and structure name, and is designed to be scalable for all screen sizes, desktop and mobile. The map also includes the ability to overlay aerial photography through a control in the right hand corner of the screen.

The City of Auburn permit app is designed by the City's IT Department - GIS Division. To use the application, please use your desktop, laptop or mobile device to visit the City's website at www.auburnalabama.org/maps and click "Interactive Maps" and then click "Permit Map." ## Corner Construction Project Recognized with State & National Awards

The Corner Construction project, completed in mid-August of this year, has been recognized by the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) - Alabama Chapter for a State Merit Award in the 2015 ASLA Design Awards Program. This award is a result of the hard work and dedication of the City's Corner Construction project team.

The Corner Construction project was also a 2015 Obelisk Award winner for the Sitework/Landscape/Hardscape category of the Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC) Alabama Ex-



cellence in Construction Awards. Bailey-Harris Construction (BHCC) was presented the award at the 26th Annual Excellence in Construction awards ceremony in Birmingham in October.

According to the award write-up "BHCC was tasked with demolition & reconstruction of Toomer's Corner in the heart of the City of Auburn. To match improvements on the University's corner, BHCC renovated the three remaining corners by installing a new subgrade, pedestrian & traffic rated pavers including the beloved Tiger Paw in the center of the intersection. walls, LED lighting, new traffic poles and expanded sidewalks were installed all while maintaining safe access to the downtown shops, restaurants, bars & residences."

### About the Project

The Corner Construction project was a once in a lifetime renovation and revitalization of Auburn's most iconic location. The City of Auburn worked closely with Auburn University to ensure that the campus corner, the intersection and the city corners complemented one another. The Corner Construction project was designed by City of Auburn staff to enhance a sense of place at the heart of downtown Auburn, where campus and city meet and where both gather together to celebrate. In that spirit, the intersection was raised to the level of the sidewalk to create a plaza during downtown events. The corners were expanded with new seating, tree wells, and new lighting. The project also provided an opportunity to maintain, improve or replace decades old infrastructure under the concrete, and make permanent the tiger paw that the Auburn University Student Government Association had repainted annually for years.
