## **16th Annual Mayor's Memorial Day Breakfast**

Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. and the Auburn Veterans Committee cordially invite Auburn citizens to attend the 16th Annual Mayor's Memorial Day Breakfast on Monday, May 26th at 8 a.m. at the Hotel at Auburn University and Dixon Conference Center. This annual event is held to honor the United States Military and those soldiers who have made the supreme sacrifice. Tickets for the breakfast will be available starting April 21st at City Hall for \$25 each or \$250 for a table of 10. Proceeds from ticket sales go to the Auburn Veterans Memorial Fund.

#### **2014 Distinguished Veteran**

Retired Naval Commander Tom Eden will be the guest of honor and the recipient of the 2014 City of Auburn Distinguished Veteran Award. Eden graduated from West End High School in Nashville, Tennessee where he was a member of the Junior Army ROTC program. During World War II, he was drafted into the United States Navy at age 17. After serving the Navy aboard ship, he was honorably discharged and entered the Alabama Polytechnic Institute. He graduated with a degree in Ornamental Horticulture with a specialty in Landscape Design. After graduation, Eden was called to serve in the Korean War as an officer in the Navy. He completed 23 years of active and reserve duty, retiring as a Commander. Eden has called Auburn home since attending Alabama Polytechnic Institute. After retiring from the Navy he spent his time teaching Landscape Design at Auburn University.

#### **2014 Hero Remembered**

This year marks the third year the Auburn Heroes Remembered Award will be presented to the family of a local distinguished veteran who has passed away. This year's Auburn Heroes Remembered Award will go to Jonathan "Jay" Crowder. Crowder was appointed to the U. S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD, class of 1944. He then joined the battleship Massachusetts in the Pacific theater, where he earned his 'Gold Wings' as a Naval Aviator during World War II. As commander of the "Heavy Photographic Squadron" VCP-61 at NAS Agana in Guam, his mission included flying the first A3D-2P jets for cartographic mapping in the Pacific Ocean and updating maps of Vietnam, New Zealand and China. He later became the executive officer of the aircraft carrier Oriskany. Crowder was promoted to captain and became the commander of the Naval Photographic Center in Washington, D.C., where he oversaw the official photography of the White House and Lyndon B. Johnson Library. After 33 years in the Navy, Crowder retired to Auburn and was instrumental in forming what is now the Veteran's Committee, originally tasked by Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. to raise funds for the Auburn Veterans Memorial.

#### **Wreath Laying**

Immediately following the breakfast, at 10 a.m., Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. will lead a memorial wreath laying ceremony at the Auburn Veterans Memorial Monument, located at the northeast corner of

Ross Street and Glenn Avenue. Ceremony attendees are encouraged to park at the Douglas J. Watson Municipal Complex and Felton Little Park. During the ceremony, Ross Street will be closed from Glenn Avenue to Harper Avenue to allow for parking for the disabled.

## Trash Amnesty Week May 19-23

During the spring, many Auburn residents work to beautify homes and yards. During the week of May 19-23, 2014, fees normally assessed to Auburn residents for the collection of oversized yard debris and other bulky waste will be waived to accommodate these "spring cleaning" needs. Residents are asked to abide by the following guidelines when placing items out for collection:

Debris should be placed at the curb no later than 6:00 a.m. on your regularly scheduled collection day. Please avoid placing items on or near mailboxes, utility boxes or poles, or other fixed objects. All items should be properly contained or bundled so they do not fall into the street or down storm drains.

The City will accept yard waste, appliances, and bulky items for collection. No other waste materials, including household garbage or hazardous waste, should be placed out for collection with debris.

Limbs and other debris should be no longer than 5 feet in length.

To facilitate recycling efforts, please separate all wood debris, including limbs and grass clippings, from metal items.

Every reasonable effort will be made to maintain the established collection schedule but due to the large volume of debris expected during Trash Amnesty Week, citizens may experience a delay in their collection schedule.

## Auburn Communications: 911

As this issue of Open Line hits mailboxes, National 911 Education Month is underway. This month-long national campaign is designed to help citizens of all ages recognize the crucial role that 911 services play in our lives and to help us all be prepared if we ever need them.

The Communications Division of the Auburn Public Safety Department is responsible for receiving 911 calls for service and for dispatching and relaying information to police, fire and first responders. The Communications Division uses the latest computerized technology including Enhanced 911, Phase 2 911 and the City of Auburn's extensive GIS mapping data to ensure that police, fire and emergency medical assistance can be dispatched as quickly as possible.

Auburn Communications handles all 911 calls originating from within the Auburn city limits, Auburn University and the Auburn Police jurisdiction. In Fiscal Year 2013, the Communications Division handled 194,439 emergency dispatch calls.

A 911 call represents a high-stress emergency situation and may well involve a life or death emergency. Emergencies can happen at any time, and we should always be prepared. In an emergency scenario, you can help Auburn Public Safety render assistance as quickly and efficiently as possible by remembering the following:

Know your Location: When you dial 911, your call is directed to the nearest 911 Communications Center. Know the address where the emergency is happening or be able to provide street names, intersections, businesses or other nearby landmarks to help emergency personnel find you as quickly as possible.

Remain Calm and Give Detailed Information: Auburn's professional communications staff are trained to get the information emergency responders need to be able to come to your assistance. As concisely as possible, answer all of questions the

operators ask and follow their instructions. As they speak with you, they're entering information into a Computer Aided Dispatch system which gives emergency responders the information needed to quickly and efficiently respond.

Don't Hang Up: In an emergency, stay on the line with the 911 operators until you are told it is OK to hang up. If you accidentally dial 911, but don't have an emergency, stay on the line to let an operator know it was a mistake. This will keep the operator from having to unnecessarily dispatch an emergency responder to your address.
